# The Art of Airstream Cooking

## Pork Chili Verde

This classic Mexican dish is a good one to consider for a potluck contribution at a rally, or, if you multiply the servings, one for a great dinner party at home. The recipe from Kay Chun in the New York Times is a little work, but mostly just the peeling of the peppers. I made 90 servings of this and froze it ahead of time for my husband's birthday party, and it was fabulous. And yes, it was a ton of work to make that much, but I cheated a little and bought a big can of poblanos from a restaurant supply house and they were already peeled. But I still ran them under the broiler with the jalapeno and tomatillos for a little char. And yes, I know pork isn't kosher, but my husband isn't Jewish, and it was HIS birthday, after all, so all was well!

If you can find them, use poblanos; if not, you can use Anaheim chilis. And, if possible, use sweet onions rather than plain yellow.

### Ingredients

- 1 pound of tomatillos, husks removed
- 3 poblano chiles, stemmed and flattened out
- 1-4 jalapeños, stemmed, and flattened (depending upon how spicy you like things)
- 4 large, peeled garlic cloves
- 3 T extra-virgin olive oil
- Salt and pepper
- 1 loosely packed cup cilantro leaves and stems - save some for topping at the end
- 1½ pounds pork shoulder or butt, cut into 1-inch cubes, fat trimmed nicely
- 1½ cups finely chopped sweet onion
- 1 t ground cumin
- 1 t dried oregano
- 2 cups chicken broth
- Cooked rice, for serving

### Directions

1. Heat the broiler on high. Set the rack 6 inches from the heat. On a large, rimmed sheet pan, combine tomatillos, poblanos, jalapeño, garlic cloves, and 1 tablespoon of the oil; season with salt and toss to evenly coat.

2. Broil the mixture, turning halfway through, until nicely charred. About 15 minutes.

3. Transfer poblano chiles to a small bowl and cover with plastic wrap (or seal in a small resealable bag); let steam for 5 minutes.

4. Peel the poblanos and discard skins.

In a blender, combine the poblanos, tomatillos, jalapeño and garlic, and scrape in the accumulated juices on the sheet pan. (There is a lot of good flavor in the caramelized juices!) Add the cilantro and purée until smooth.

5. Heat oven to 325 degrees F.

6. In a large Dutch oven, heat the remaining 2 tablespoons of oil over medium. Season the pork with salt and pepper, then add half to the pot. Cook, turning occasionally, until browned all over. 5 minutes. Transfer to a plate and repeat with the remaining pork.

7. After all the pork has been browned and removed from the pot, add the onion and cook, stirring occasionally, until softened. 3 minutes. Add cumin and oregano, then cook, stirring, until fragrant, about 1 minute. Return the pork to the pot (with any accumulated juices), add the broth and tomatillo purée, and season with salt and pepper.

8. Bring to a boil, cover, and transfer to the oven. Roast until pork is very tender, 1.5 hours. Season stew with salt and pepper to taste.

9. Divide the pork chili verde among shallow bowls, garnish with chopped cilantro, and serve warm, with rice.

# New Heritage Numbers 1208 and 26019

This month, we review the two newest Heritage Numbers, both approved by the WBCCI International Board of Trustees (IBT) in October 2025. Like all the Heritage Number honorees before them, these two couples did things that brought publicity and prestige to WBCCI and helped our club grow. Their contributions, though made over three decades ago, have been recognized outside of our club and are still considered historically important today.

- 1208 – Frank and Vivian Sargent for the development of the China Caravans in the 1980s

- 26019 – Rutherford “Bud” and Bettye Cooper for the development of the Vintage Airstream Club (VAC) Intra-Club in the 1990s

These are their stories.

### 1208 – Frank and Vivian Sargent

Frank Sargent was employed at the AC Spark Plug Division of General Motors as a die cast inspection superintendent when, in late 1957, he and his first wife, Evelyn, joined WBCCI.

In 1958, they became members of the new Michigan Unit, and Frank subsequently served as President of the Michigan Unit in 1962-63. In May 1963, Frank and his two sons founded Thetford Engineering in a garage in Thetford Township, near Flint, Michigan. Their first product was a slide-action RV dump valve, soon followed by a porcelain RV toilet. In 1967, Frank retired from General Motors to concentrate on Thetford full time, and by 1970, Thetford also launched RV toilet tissue and holding tank chemicals, as well as an all-plastic RV toilet and the famed Porta Potti®.

Evelyn passed away in 1969, and Frank married second wife Vivian in 1970. From 1982 to 1984, and again from 1986 to 1987, Frank served as the WBCCI International Relations Standing Committee Chair. It was during his first stint in that position that Frank and Vivian developed the series of nine China Caravans that ran from 1985 through 1988, including making a personal scouting trip to China in 1984. Frank and Vivian then served as the leaders of the first China Caravan in 1985.

The China Caravans were the most ambitious Caravans ever developed by WBCCI, rivaling the European, African, and Around the World Caravans that were developed by the Airstream Company in the 1950s and 1960s. The Sargents arranged for Airstream, Inc. to build 11 custom 20-foot "China Clipper" Airstreams to be used and reused for this series of caravans to keep participant costs down. Caravan participants experienced a China that no longer exists today. They toured rural areas whose people rarely saw cars (since personal cars did not exist in China at the time), never saw foreigners, and would have had no idea what a travel trailer was. They also visited ancient treasures like the Great Wall of China and the Terra Cotta Army. They saw some of China's rapidly modernizing major cities, as well as Hong Kong (then a British Colony). The China Caravans brought immense publicity and prestige to WBCCI that is unrivaled by any other activity developed by the club. The first China Caravan received the most publicity, including national TV coverage and stories in numerous magazines and newspapers, with the Sargents often in the middle of that coverage.

Frank and Vivian then went on to lead the 1987 Goodwill America-China Caravan that hosted Chinese people for a tour of the United States in Airstreams. Later, they had a 23' Classic Limited Airstream custom made for them by the Airstream "specialty vehicles" division bearing a "China Clipper" badge and utilizing the 1987-88 23' Sovereign/Excelsa floorplan. This was the smallest Airstream Limited ever made.

In 1989, the Sargents became one of WBCCI's first lifetime members, shortly after the club began offering lifetime memberships. Vivian passed away in 2005 and Frank in 2009 (at the age of 100), but perhaps because they were Lifetime Members and their passing was not immediately reported, Frank continued to be listed in WBCCI Membership Directories through 2010 and Vivian through 2011.

It is for the three years the Sargents devoted to developing the China Caravans that their Big Red Number (BRN) 1208 was approved to become a Heritage Number. That honor is richly deserved. No single contribution by any other members since the 1960s brought as much prestige and publicity to WBCCI as did those 1980s caravans. The China Caravans are a shining example of what members of this club can accomplish when given the opportunity. The caravans they developed are still awe inspiring to many club members more than 40 years later.

## 26019 – Rutherford "Bud" and Bettye Cooper

You can say that trailers were always in Bud Cooper's blood as he grew up camping in them while his father worked for the Palace Trailer Company in Flint, Michigan. Bud even sold trailers for a while after he and Bettye married in 1947, though he soon transitioned to a career as a mechanical engineer, working for several companies over four decades. Bud was also an amateur archeologist, having spent time at digs in the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico and in Turkey (Türkiye), before his fascination with Airstreams began.

Bud and Bettye Cooper joined WBCCI and the Michigan Unit in 1972 when they were living in Grand Rapids, Michigan. In 1978, the Coopers moved to Huntington, Indiana and transferred to the Fort Wayne Indiana Unit, with Bud becoming the 2nd VP of that Unit in 1989. In 1990, they relocated back to Michigan and the Michigan Unit. After retirement, the Coopers wintered in Pharr, Texas for several years so Bud could easily visit archeological sites across the border in Mexico. The Coopers briefly transferred their Unit affiliation to the Washington DC and South Texas Units during the early 2000s but eventually returned to the Michigan Unit.

After several years in WBCCI with "newer" Airstreams, Bud found he preferred older models so that he did not worry about them as much during trips into Mexico. In 1990, he purchased and restored a 1962 22' Safari. That old Safari became an object of interest at every rally the Coopers attended, so by mid-1992, Bud began drumming up interest in forming a club for vintage Airstreams.

The Vintage Airstream Club (VAC) was formally chartered as a WBCCI Intra-Club at the Mid-Winter IBT meeting in January 1993, with Bud as its first President. After founding the VAC, Bud rescued a 1948 22' Airstream Liner from a junkyard in Bay City, Michigan for \$300 and renovated it from the frame up. That Liner was the fourth vintage Airstream that Bud restored, and it is currently owned by other WBCCI members.

Bud's efforts within the VAC did not stop at just being the founder and first President of the first successful vintage trailer club in North America. For many years, Bud was the VAC Technical Advisor as he created surveys and used other resources to build the understanding of vintage Airstream years, models, features, appliances, and other details that we take for granted today. Bud helped organize the Vintage Airstream Parade and Open House events that are still some of the most anticipated activities at the annual WBCCI International Rally.

The "Bud Cooper Best of Show Trophy" is awarded every year at the VAC Concours d'Elegance during the International Rally. In 1996, Bud organized the first VAC Wagon Wheel Caravan of vintage Airstreams to the International Rally, a caravan that was repeated by the VAC for many years. In 2000, he even organized a Vintage Airstream Caravan to Mexico, Guatemala, and Belize, with all but one of the 11 participating Airstreams being from the 1940s through the 1970s. Bud made sure that month-long caravan visited several archaeologically important sites.

The VAC that Bud founded quickly grew to become WBCCI's largest intra-club by a significant margin, always maintaining a membership of several hundred strong, though it was recently surpassed by the new Grapes and Grains Intra-Club that has grown even larger.

In the more than three decades since its founding, the VAC has brought hundreds of new members to WBCCI that likely would not have otherwise joined, but were drawn to the community of like-minded vintage Airstream enthusiasts for their comradery and maintenance and restoration knowledge. Through it all, Bettye was Bud's constant companion and supporter, allowing him to field phone calls and answer letters and emails at all times of the day and night as the vintage Airstream community grew.

Bud's efforts to build enthusiasm and resources for vintage trailers did not stop with the VAC. Bud was instrumental in the revival of the Tin Can Tourists (TCT) as an "all brand" vintage trailer club in the late 1990s. Bud was also a constant promoter and resource for the creation of the vintage trailer parts industry that exists today.

Such resources did not exist in the 1980s and early 1990s. Several years ago, Bud and Bettye were the very first inductees into the TCT Hall of Fame for their contributions to the vintage trailer community.

Right after founding the VAC, the Coopers purchased their own WBCCI lifetime membership, confirming their lifelong commitment to WBCCI, just like the Sargents. Bud passed away in 2009 and Bettye in 2010. They may be gone, but their legacy should not be forgotten. Their 26019 is the first (and currently only) 5-digit BRN to be recognized as a Heritage Number, and rightly so. What they did to create the VAC has not been repeated by any other intra-club. One intra-club has been around longer and one is larger, but neither can match the VAC's combination of size and lasting impact, both within and outside WBCCI, a legacy more than 30 years in the making with no signs of slowing down any time soon.

# Feeling, Data and Heritage

A New Way Forward for Region 1 and a Conversation Worth Having Across the Club

Every membership organization eventually runs into the same seven words: "This is how it's always been done."

If you have been part of any club long enough, you know exactly what those words feel like. They are not always said with bad intent. Often, they come from people who genuinely love what they have helped build and want to protect it. But they have a way of closing doors before anyone has a chance to ask whether the door even needs to stay where it is. And in every membership organization, there are quiet members on the other side of those doors who eventually drift away because they never quite found their place inside them.

That is something the Airstream Club, like every great organization, has the chance to address. Not by setting tradition aside, our heritage is one of the things that makes this club worth belonging to, but by adding to it.

**The way forward is a thoughtful blend of feeling, data, and heritage. All three matter. None of them work without the other two.**

That is what this survey is really about.

## Why a Survey, Why Now?

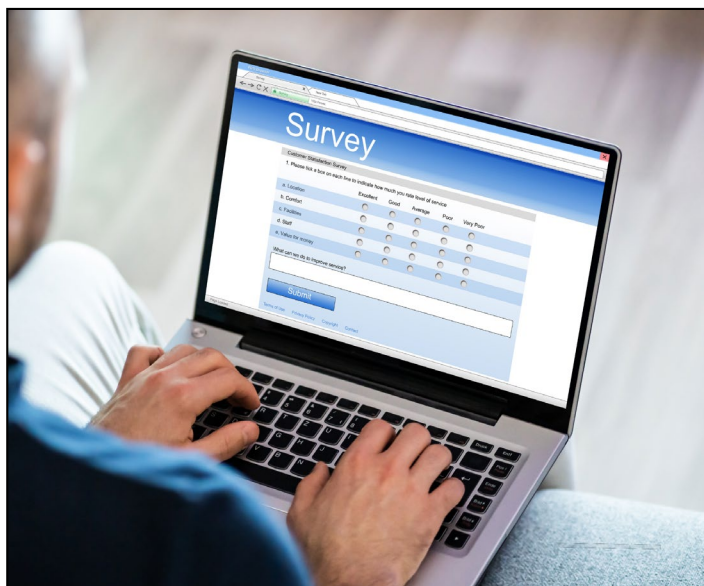
Region 1 has always been one of the most active corners of Airstream Club International. We span an enormous geographic area, from the Atlantic Provinces and Quebec down through New England, and our local clubs each have their own distinct character. But we are not a group of folks just camping.

**We are part of an outdoor recreation association with a proud legacy to carry forward, and part of carrying that legacy forward is delicately balancing the needs and interests of every member we serve. That diversity is a strength.**

For most of our history, the honest answer to those questions has been: **we go on instinct**. We rely on the conversations we have at rallies, the feedback we hear from the same handful of voices, and our best guesses about everyone else.

Last month, every member across our five local clubs (Cape Cod, Connecticut, New England, Northeast Mountaineers, and Quebec Maritimes Canada), along with our Members-at-Large, received an invitation to take part in our Region 1 Membership Survey.

That is exactly the spirit of this work. The survey is our way of moving from assumption to understanding. Instead of guessing what members want, we are going to ask them and then listen.

## What's in the Survey

The questions are intentionally short and practical, and they fall into a few clear buckets.

**The first is simply getting to know our members.** We ask about home clubs, age group, and who members typically travel with when they attend events. We recognize military veterans and first responders in our ranks. We ask how long members have been part of ACI, how many Region 1 events they attended in 2025, and how many they are planning to attend in 2026. And we ask whether they belong to any Intra-Clubs or hold affiliate memberships with other Region 1 clubs, because we want to understand how members move through the broader Airstream community, not just their home club.

**The second is communication,** and this is one of the areas where we have the most to learn. Our members live across many different communication preferences. Some thrive on email, some on texting, some on social platforms, some on the printed page, some on a good phone call. Those preferences are loosely tied to generations, loosely tied to lifestyle, and entirely valid.

By asking members to rank their preferred channels, we can start to see where our membership actually is, how each member wants to hear about what is going on, and where we may have been missing each other simply because we were not meeting them where they are. The goal is not to abandon any one channel, and certainly not to suggest that any preference is the wrong one. The goal is to ensure no member feels left out because of how we chose to send the message.

**The third section we are most excited about is travel preferences.** This is where the rubber actually meets the road for rally planning. We ask how members currently use their Airstream, how many hours they are willing to travel for a rally or event, and what kinds of Airstreaming events interest them most. We ask whether they would be open to paying additional fees for a special off-site experience during a rally, and we ask what kinds of activities they would actually enjoy once they are there. These are questions every rally planner has wondered about. Now we will have answers.

**Finally, we leave space for open feedback.** The questions members can answer in their own words. Some of the most valuable insights from any survey come from the things you cannot put in a multiple-choice format. Themes on open responses are a great way to help us refine the survey in the future.

None of these questions are meant to be a test. **They are meant to give local club leadership a clearer picture of who their members are and what their members need.**

## Where the Answers Actually Go

This is the part that matters most, and the part we want to be transparent about from the beginning. The survey is not going into a black hole.

Gallup, the global research firm known for its work on engagement and performance, has found that **well-designed surveys provide structured insight into how people think, feel, and engage with the organizations they belong to. Their research also shows that organizations that measure feedback and then act on it see higher engagement and stronger retention.** This approach applies just as much to member-based communities like ours as it does to the workplaces Gallup is best known for studying. That principle is at the heart of how we are approaching this work.

Once responses are in, the Region 1 team will aggregate the data and share it back with each local club to support their own planning and decision-making. A club that learns some of its members are shifting from Facebook to Instagram can adjust its communication. A club that discovers its members are willing to drive four hours for the right rally can plan more ambitious destination events. A club that sees strong interest in off-site experiences can start building relationships with local vendors and venues. A club whose members are also affiliated with a neighboring club can coordinate joint events instead of competing for the same weekend.

The aggregated results will also be made available on the Region 1 website, so members can see what we learned and how it is shaping our work. We want this to be a conversation, not a one-way data collection.

## Why One Survey Isn't Enough

It would be easy to treat this survey as a single project with a beginning and an end. Send it out, look at the results, file it away, move on. That is not what we are trying to do, and it is not what we would encourage any other region to do either.

Surveys matter because they replace assumption with understanding. For too long, member-based organizations of every kind have planned their events, written their newsletters, and made their decisions based on the loudest voices in the room and the best information available at the time. The members who would have come to a different kind of rally never get the chance to say so. A survey, done well, gives those members a voice, and it gives leadership the honest information they need to serve everyone, not just the people who happen to be standing nearby.

It is also worth saying plainly: the size of a club is not the same thing as the health of a club. A larger membership roster does not automatically mean higher engagement, stronger participation, or happier members. A smaller club with members who show up, speak up, and feel genuinely connected is doing something right that a larger, quieter club is not. Headcount is a starting point, not a scorecard. The only way to know how a club is actually doing, large or small, is to ask the people in it.

Following the data is not about chasing trends or abandoning tradition. We are not trying to change the club, the heritage, or the history. We are trying to refine the activities and experiences we offer so that we retain the members we have and welcome those who are still deciding whether this is for them. That is the blend we keep coming back to: feeling, data, and heritage. People stay where they feel seen. People show up where they feel heard.

And here is the part we want to be most clear about: a single survey is a snapshot. It tells us who our members are and what they want today. But our members are evolving, their lives, their schedules, their preferences, the platforms they live on, the kinds of experiences they are looking for. If we want to evolve as fast as they do, we have to keep listening. That means conducting annual membership surveys and being willing to update our approach when the data tells us something has shifted.

We are excited to see what we learn. And we are even more excited about what we will learn the second time we ask, and the third time, and the time after that.

## Silver Things in the Georgia Mountains

I'm sitting beside a creek. A cool breeze has me second-guessing my T-shirt and shorts. I inhale the sweet scent of spring in the Appalachians and listen to nature's melody: birdsong mixed with water tumbling over rocks.

On the last Wednesday in March, I hauled my Airstream deep into the Georgia mountains and found myself here, at the Top of Georgia Airstream Park (TOG). Memories flood back. My grandparents lived 45 minutes from here, in Tiger, Georgia. I remember riding in Grandpa's truck with my tiny hands gripping the windowsill and my strawberry-blonde curls tangling in the mountain wind. I'd stare out in wide-eyed wonder as we drove past "the place with all the silver things." We never visited TOG, but I never forgot the silver things. And here I am, all grown up, sitting beside my silver home, tucked in beside all the other silver things, wondering why on earth it took me so long to find my way back to this place.

Just after I backed into my creek-side site, I rode my bike half a mile up the winding road to a forest service trailhead, where I chained my bike to a tree and set off on the Andrews Cove Trail. Most of the forest was still asleep—the trees were bare except for the dark green, waxy leaves of the rhododendron and mountain laurel. The forest was quiet except for an occasional squirrel rustling through brown leaves. But the early risers were stirring: tiny purple violets dotting the trail and vibrant green buds just beginning to unfurl. I hiked a seven-mile loop that included a stretch of the Appalachian Trail, with sweeping, panoramic views of the Blue Ridge Mountains in every direction. By the time I rolled back into camp, I was already half in love with the place.

That first evening I made fast friends with several full-timers who winter here, and before I knew it, I had an invitation to come back for their Spring Fling Rally.

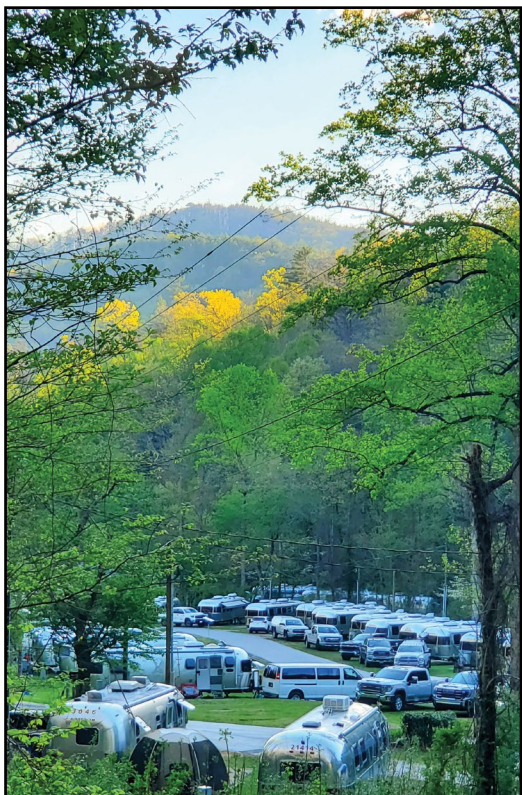
Two weeks later, I returned, and the spring transformation was breathtaking. The mountains had woken up! Lime-green leaves blanketed the hillsides, and dogwoods burst with snow-white blooms.



The weather was perfect: chilly nights, days in the high seventies, and crystal-clear blue skies. After dark, the heavens were a tapestry of thousands upon thousands of stars. It's the kind of sky that begs you to stop, gaze up, and fall into awe and wonder.

TOG's Spring Fling Rally is a two-part affair. Wednesday and Thursday are "work days," when the community rolls up their sleeves to update infrastructure, clean the facilities, freshen up the grounds, and tend the gardens. It's friends helping friends, and everyone working together to get TOG ready to welcome the Airstream community in style. Friday through Sunday shifts into celebration mode, welcoming the camping season with fellowship and fun.

On Thursday, I joined a crew installing 60 feet of underground power line to a shed. Since I had a bicycle, I became the courier, darting back and forth to the tool shop for supplies, learning my way around the facilities, and getting to know new friends in the most hands-on way.

There's something about working alongside people that skips right past small talk, and I loved every bit of it.

Friday kicked off with a breakfast and mingle, followed by a guided hike on TOG's own trail system. The trail begins at the lower loop, then splits about a third of a mile in. Head right and you climb to a towering mountainside cross. Head left and you snake further up the mountain (a 2.2-mile round trip with 450 feet of elevation gain and lovely views worth every step).

While some rally-goers ventured out to the towns of Helen and Hiawassee to bike, fish, and explore on their own, others simply... stayed.

With a creek babbling through camp, mountain views, and friendly neighbors in every direction, there were reasons enough not to wander.

Saturday morning brought breakfast casseroles and a conversation I'll treasure. I shared my book, *Perfect Unfolding: Seven Years of Life-Changing Adventure, One Year That Broke Me Open*, and what followed was a rich, hour-long discussion about freedom, full-time life on the road, following your heart when the path isn't clear, and trusting the unfolding even when there isn't a plan. The afternoon gave way to games and laughter, a cookout, and then Top of Georgia's hilarious rendition of "The Not So Newlywed Game." Some tears were shed from laughing!

Sunday wrapped it all up beautifully with another delicious breakfast and a talk that left people more wide-eyed: a spiritual exploration of the creation of Earth, inspired by lessons from the Artemis space expedition. It was the perfect note to close a rally built on fellowship, curiosity, and the deep pleasure of being with friends new and old.

And speaking of space expeditions: hold on to your trailer hitch, because Top of Georgia has a piece of history that deserves its own moment.

The park's host office is a 1961 Airstream Trade Wind 24 that is no ordinary trailer. NASA purchased this little beauty as a field office for the Marshall Space Flight Center Mercury Redstone program. It was customized as a workspace, with no plumbing, sleeping area, or creature comforts. Inside, there's a full-sized desk at the front (where TOG guests check in), filing closets and drawers along the curb-side, a dinette on the street-side, and metal desks in the back. It was once a NASA working office, and it once again serves a similar purpose.

Restored NASA Airstreams can also be found at the Smithsonian, the Kennedy Space Center, and the Marshall Space Flight Center.

But there is something especially wonderful about TOG's 1961 Trade Wind. It's more than a museum piece! It's alive again, doing the work it was built to do, in the mountains of northeast Georgia. Add in the fact that the Top of Georgia Airstream Club was founded in 1961, and you've got two reasons to celebrate that year.

So if you're looking for mountain solitude, starry skies, genuine fellowship, and a brush with NASA history (all from the comfort of your own silver home on wheels), point your tires toward the northeast Georgia mountains and stop by for a visit. Top of Georgia awaits, and trust me: it was worth the wait.

# Meet the Community: Jerry Hanson, BRN 7212

**Marine Veteran | Paramedic Firefighter |  
First-Generation Airstreamer | Caravan Builder**

Some Airstream journeys begin with decades of tradition. Others begin with a decision, sometimes later in life, to do something different and fully embrace what comes next.

For Jerry Hanson, Airstreaming didn't come from family legacy or years of exposure. It came at the intersection of two long careers, a shared vision for retirement, and a desire to experience not just destinations, but the journey itself.

Born in the Midwest and spending part of his childhood in Munich, Germany, Jerry returned to the United States and eventually enlisted in the Marine Corps, where he served for 20 years. After retiring from military service, he began a second career as a paramedic firefighter with the Arlington County Fire Department in Virginia, serving an additional 22 years. Across both careers, Jerry developed a mindset rooted in preparedness, structure, and service, qualities that continue to shape how he approaches life today.

As he and his wife, Jacy, began looking ahead to retirement, they wanted a way to travel together that offered both flexibility and comfort. Their Goldendoodle, Iko, quickly became part of that vision as well. "If we're going to be on the road," Jacy told him, "I want a Marriott suite on wheels." That standard quickly narrowed their search, and in 2022, they purchased their first Airstream, a new 25-foot Flying Cloud, becoming first-generation Airstreamers with no prior RV experience.

### A Fast Start and a Natural Fit

Like many new owners, Jerry approached Airstream ownership with research and intention. But what set his experience apart was how quickly he moved from ownership to involvement.

After joining the Airstream Club International in 2022, Jerry and Jacy attended their first rally and were introduced to a broader community they hadn't previously known existed. Encouraged by Jacy, Jerry leaned in fully, drawing on his natural strengths as an organizer and leader.

Through the Virginia Airstream Club 109, Jerry became actively involved in club leadership and is currently serving as First Vice President, with plans to step into the role of President in October.

### Building Something New

Jerry's impact on the Airstream community took shape quickly through an idea that would grow into something much larger.

Working alongside his mentor, Jeff Cutright, Jerry helped develop the Crooked Road Caravan, a concept inspired by Virginia's rich bluegrass music heritage. The caravan blends travel with live music experiences, creating a uniquely themed journey rooted in Virginia's cultural heritage.

What began as a local club caravan was elevated to an official National Caravan, launching its inaugural run in 2025.

The response exceeded expectations. Originally planned for 16 trailers, the caravan expanded to 24 due to demand, highlighting both the appeal of the concept and the strength of its execution. Designed as a shorter, 12-day experience, it also serves as an accessible entry point for members who may be hesitant to commit to longer caravans.



For Jerry, the experience reflects something deeper than logistics or planning; it represents an opportunity to create meaningful connections and open doors for others within the Airstream community.

## The Journey Over the Destination

While the Crooked Road Caravan represents his contribution to the community, Jerry's personal Airstream journey is equally defined by his travel.

One of his most memorable trips included following Dead & Company through the Carolinas, blending music, travel, and shared experiences in a way that reflects both his and Jacy's interests. More recently, the couple completed a multi-week cross-country trip through Sedona, the Grand Canyon, Monument Valley, Lake Powell, and Moab, building their route around both family connections and exploration.

For Jerry, the difference between Airstream travel and traditional vacations is clear.

"When you're in your Airstream, it's not just about getting to where you want to go, it's about the journey to that destination," he explains. "You set your own pace, and you don't miss the experiences along the way."

That philosophy extends into how they've customized their Airstream. After starting with a 25-foot Flying Cloud, they upgraded to a 27-foot Flying Cloud, which they now consider their "forever Airstream." From custom cabinetry and Corian countertops to a redesigned dinette that converts into a lounge space overlooking the rear hatch, their trailer reflects both function and personal style.

Drawing from his background in the Marine Corps and fire service, Jerry approaches Airstream travel with a strong emphasis on preparedness, keeping essential tools on hand, and planning for the unexpected. He also points to Starlink as a game changer, allowing them to stay connected even in remote locations while maintaining the freedom to travel off-grid. For newer owners, he emphasizes the importance of having the right tow vehicle. "While a half-ton truck can get the job done, a three-quarter-ton provides a much more comfortable experience over long distances," he notes.

## A New Generation of Engagement

As a first-generation Airstreamer, Jerry brings a perspective that is increasingly important to the club's future.

He encourages new owners not just to travel, but to engage.

"Go to a rally. Ask questions. Get involved," he says. "There's an entire world of opportunity within the Airstream community that many people don't even realize exists."

That mindset, combined with his leadership and initiative, positions Jerry as part of a new wave of members who are not only participating in the Airstream lifestyle but actively shaping it.



For him, the value of Airstreaming goes far beyond the road itself.

"I believe that Airstreaming is so much more than camping with like-minded adventurers. It is an opportunity to make lifelong friends from places you didn't even know existed. I would encourage anyone who has improved their quality of life through participating in the Airstream culture to pay it forward by facilitating new opportunities for future generations. This will ensure that Wally Byam's dream never fades away."

Whether you're interested in history, nature, or local culture, Minot has something for everyone!

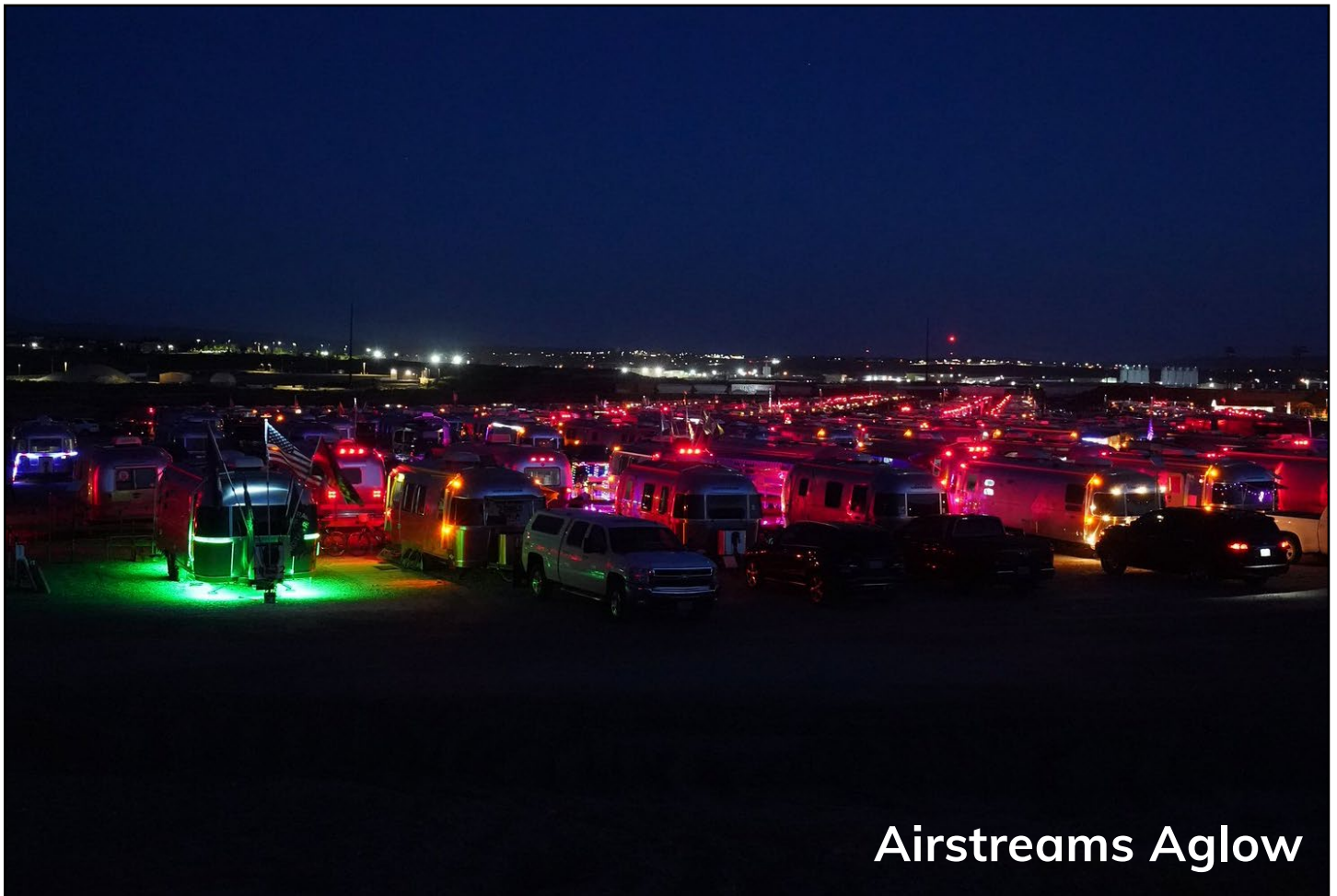

# MAKE THE MOST OF MINOT

*Must See, Local Favorites and Prairie Moments*

You've made the drive, you've set up camp, and now Minot is yours to take in. Between a thriving food scene, restored historic landmarks, public art, and trails along the Souris River, there's more to fill a trip than most visitors expect. Here's where to start:

### Things to Do in Minot

Let your imagination roam as you explore the many things to do in Minot. Dive into the rich history, experience a vibrant arts and cultural scene, play your way through family fun, and explore scenic parks tracing the curves of the Souris River.

### Signature Historic Attractions

The Scandinavian Heritage Park brings the region's roots to life with landmarks like the full-scale Gol Stave Church and iconic Dala horse. Aviation enthusiasts will want to visit the Dakota Territory Air Museum, home to restored aircraft and exhibits spanning decades of flight.

The Railroad Museum of Minot rounds out the experience, highlighting the rail lines that helped shape the city, as well as sharing insight into Minot's nickname "Little Chicago," when Minot served as a bootlegging hub between Canada and the U.S. during the Prohibition era.

### Arts & Culture

Start downtown, where local creativity is on full display. The Taube Museum of Art anchors the scene with rotating exhibits inside a beautifully restored historic building. Downtown is home to more than 25 vibrant street art murals, offering photo-worthy backdrops. Citizens Alley features multiple murals from local artists, along with a skywalk overlooking the gathering space. Additionally, Citizens Alley hosts community events and has a pickleball court between events.

Wrap up your downtown tour by standing in awe of the Union Silos mural. Union Silos is North Dakota's largest public art installation, featuring a series of large-scale portraits visible from multiple vantage points across the community and impossible to miss.

## Family-Friendly Fun

If you've got kids along for the ride, Minot has stops the whole family will love. The Magic City Discovery Center invites kids to climb, build, and play through hands-on exhibits, while the Roosevelt Park Zoo offers a scenic stroll past giraffes, lions, and more.

## Trails, Views & Outdoor Routes

If you're looking to get outside between events, a couple of local trails offer an easy way to see a different side of Minot. The Bison Plant Trail follows the Souris River, offering scenic views and a peaceful route for walking or biking along the water.

Just minutes away, the Minot Outdoor Recreation Area features more than five miles of paved and gravel trails with elevated views of the surrounding prairie. From certain vantage points, you can spot the historic Gassman Coulee Trestle Bridge in the distance. Built in 1899, this 1,792-foot railroad bridge is still in use today and remains a striking landmark, especially for those with an eye for photography.

## Where to Eat & Drink

Minot's dining scene is easy to navigate once you know what you're in the mood for. From global flavors and quick bites to hearty plates and one-of-a-kind local dishes, these categories highlight the kinds of meals you'll find across town, each with its own reason to stop in.

## Historical Roots

These downtown restaurants nod to Minot's railroad roots, each set inside historic buildings with stories to tell. The Starving Rooster serves scratch-made, wood-fired specialty pizzas, while The Depot pairs comfort classics with the charm of a restored train station. Ironhorse Kitchen & Bar continues the theme with a menu of elevated American fare in a space that pays homage to the rail line.

## Unique Foods only in Minot

Minot's food scene comes with a few surprises. Standout bites like blueberry bacon goat cheese toast, pickle soup, and knoephla poutine are just the start. Find out where to try these unique dishes on our blog at [visitminot.org/unique-foods](http://visitminot.org/unique-foods).

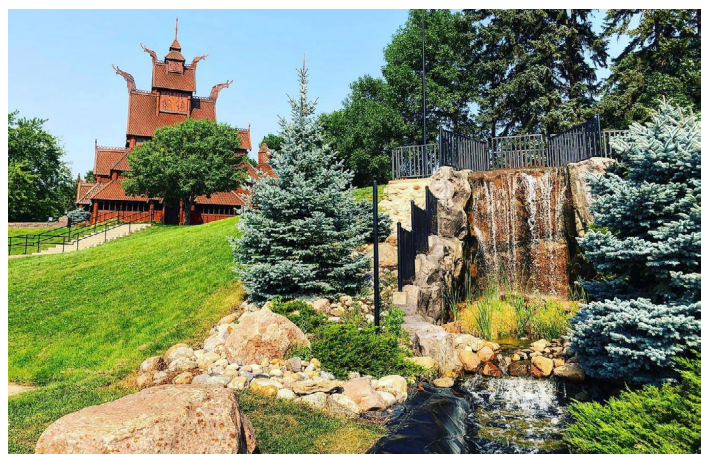
## Hearty Plates

# Community Service at Rally

*Bring food, feed kids, make an impact in Minot!*

We are excited to announce the Community Service Project for the 69th Airstream Club International Rally in Minot, ND. This year, ACI will be sponsoring the Souris Valley United Way (SVUW) Backpack Buddies program. The program provides food for school children who might not otherwise have food over the weekend. Each week, volunteers pack bags of food for local children in need.

“Backpack Buddies exists to make sure no child in our community goes hungry over the weekend,” said Christy Miller, SVUW Executive Director. “Support like this from the Airstream Club International Rally helps us not only meet that need, but expand our reach to even more students who rely on these meals each week.”

Volunteers also transport the food to ten local schools. The food is transported to the school on Thursday where the teachers discreetly place it in certain backpacks.

Here are a few facts and statistics about the program:

- This 2025-2026 school year, over 630 students across all Minot elementary schools, two Minot middle schools, and Minot Air Force Base rely on Backpack Buddies to have enough food to eat on the weekends.
- Backpack Buddies began at one school in 2014 and has grown annually. During the 2024-2025 school year, the program peaked at feeding 481 students each week.
- **\$8** = one student fed for a weekend
- **\$4,640** = weekly cost to feed elementary school students
- **\$10,800** = annual cost to stock middle school pantries
- **\$163,920** = program cost per school year.

## How can I support the Backpack Buddies program in Minot, ND?

You can support Backpack Buddies by making a monetary donation, contributing food items at the rally, or packing food bags at the rally. Each weekly food bag costs just \$8 and provides six meals and snacks.

## Donate Money

The Minot Area Community Foundation will match up to \$10,000 of donations raised at the 69th Airstream Club International Rally. Our goal is to raise \$10,000 in donations for a total of \$20,000 which could potentially stock both middle school pantries for two years.

## Donate Food

You can also bring donations of food to the rally or support the economy in Minot by purchasing food items at a local grocery store. Two local grocery stores; Cash Wise and Marketplace Foods, will have displays of needed items for easy shopping. Perhaps consider doing food drives at your local rallies leading up to the International Rally. Items needed are listed in the box above.

# Making Every Drop Count

## Managing Fresh, Gray and Black Water at the International Rally

One of the things that makes an International Rally special is the chance to camp together in a true “rally style” environment. This year, most electric sites will not have individual water or sewer hookups, so a little planning will go a long way toward a comfortable stay. Each RV will receive one water fill, and pump-out service will be provided every four days. In addition, yard hydrants will be available throughout the grounds for those who would like to use jugs or portable bladders to transport and refill fresh water on their own.

With just a few smart habits—and a little help from available facilities—we can all make our fresh water last longer and keep our gray and black tanks from filling as quickly. Many experienced Airstreamers camp this way often, so think of this rally as a great opportunity to practice (or learn) skills that come in handy anytime you’re camping without full hookups.

#### Fresh Water: Stretch What You Have

Even if you arrive with a full tank, you’ll want to use water thoughtfully from the start. The easiest strategy is to treat your onboard tank as a limited resource and use it only when it truly makes sense.

#### Helpful ideas:

- Use portable water bladders or containers to transport water from the fill stations to your site. This lets you top off your tank without moving your trailer.
- Keep a drinking-water jug inside the trailer so you’re not using tank water every time someone wants a glass of water.
- Turn off the pump when you leave for the day—it prevents accidental water loss from small leaks or drips.
- If you are using bottled water for drinking, consider using tank water only for washing and flushing.

A little awareness goes a long way. Most people are surprised how long a fresh tank lasts once you’re paying attention.

#### Gray Water: Where Most of the Water Goes

For most of us, gray tanks fill faster than black tanks. The good news is that a few small changes can dramatically reduce how much water ends up in the gray tank.

**Smart ways to minimize gray-tank use:**

- Wash dishes in a dishpan instead of letting water run into the sink. When you're finished, save the dishwater in a jug to flush the toilet.
- Catch the cold water in a jug that runs while you wait for the shower to warm up. That water is perfectly good for rinsing dishes or flushing.
- Wipe plates and pans with a paper towel before washing—less grease means less water needed.
- Use disposable cups or plates occasionally for quick meals to reduce dishwashing.
- Turn off the faucet while brushing teeth or shaving.
- If you're cooking simple meals, choose ones that require fewer pots and pans.

These little habits make a noticeable difference, especially over several days.

**Showers: The “Navy Shower” Still Works Best**

If there's one habit that saves the most water, it's the classic Navy shower:

1. Turn the water on just long enough to get wet.
2. Turn it off while soaping and shampooing.
3. Turn it back on briefly to rinse.

You'll still feel clean, but you'll use a fraction of the water—and create far less gray water in the process.

Just as important, take advantage of the on-site restroom and shower facilities. Using them regularly—even once a day—can significantly extend both your fresh water supply and your gray tank capacity, especially over several days of the rally.

**Black Tank: Easier Than You Think**

The black tank actually tends to last longer than the gray tank if you manage it well.

Helpful tips:

- Use the rally restrooms when convenient—every visit saves tank capacity.
- Add enough water to the tank after each dump (or when you arrive) so solids don't build up.
- Avoid using excessive water when flushing—just enough to do the job works fine. Many RVers use a dedicated cup with saved water to rinse.
- If you're using dishpan water to flush, you're reducing gray-tank use and helping the black tank at the same time.

**A Rally Is About Community—This Is Part of It**

Camping without hookups may feel different at first, but it's also part of the fun. Many of us started our Airstream adventures camping this way, and it's surprisingly easy once you get into the rhythm.

These same water-saving habits aren't just for the International Rally—they're useful anytime you're camping with limited or no hookups, whether at a state park, a boondocking site, or your favorite off-the-grid destination.

A little planning, a few conservation habits, and smart use of the water-fill stations and on-site facilities will help everyone stay comfortable throughout the rally.

And who knows—you may discover that you don't need nearly as much water as you thought!

## *Airstream Club on Hunt for Travel Guides, Mementos*

The Wally Byam Caravan Club has a rich history in caravanning. The Club started with its first organized caravan in 1972: the Louisville Post International Caravan. Before then, all caravans were led by Airstream, Inc.

In the ensuing 54 years, the Club has organized over 600 caravans.

Early on, everything was done on paper and through the mail. To sign up for a caravan, you filled out a coupon you could clip from the Blue Beret magazine and mailed it to the caravan leader.

Caravans all had typed and hand-drawn parts of their travel guides. Many people kept those guides as mementos of the experience.

For a long time, the Club maintained a good number of these guides and many people could look through them at International Rallies.

Over time, however, many of the guides were lost or damaged.

Today, we have 51 travel guides. And they won't get lost or damaged by water, wear and tear because we have digitized all of them.

These guides are written by volunteer leaders, usually using the guide from a prior year or other caravan as a template as part of the caravan preparation process.

Caravan leaders volunteer their time and effort in arranging the activities, making reservations and preparing the guide (among 1,000 other duties) in exchange for going on the trip and sharing the experiences with new friends.

The travel guides are one of the consistent physical mementos of the trip each caravan shares.

Sadly, of the guides we have, the oldest is from 2006. As a club, we are missing a significant piece of our caravanning history. Having access to these old travel guides would be a great resource to create new caravans from old caravans or improve existing caravans.

We certainly don't want the Illinois Time Forgot, the Hoosier Heritage, Goin' Golfin' and hundreds of other caravans to be lost.

We will scan it and make sure it is retained as part of the club's rich caravanning history. In fact, if anyone wants to bring old travel guides or mementos to the International Rally in Minot in August, I can get them scanned there and return them if they still want them. (Just call or text me at 704-806-6772).

In a similar vein, if you know a fellow Airstreamer who keeps everything, please ask him or her to consider digitizing and sharing their treasures.

That will make our rich caravanning history even richer.

As you read this, Region 9 is having a relaxing May after a packed March and April. We launched spring with **Wally's Workshop**, March 20-22, at the North Texas Airstream Community (NTAC) hosted by the North Texas Airstream Club (NTxAC). This was the largest workshop since this rally kicked off in 2023, with 61 rigs represented and 115 attendees. The "spa day" included minor repairs, washing and waxing, door/window upgrades, rig/tow vehicle/hitch weighing, and black/gray tank cleaning, all done right there in the park. Among other topics, Saturday's program equipped the attendees with some DIY tips (thank you Brad Driver from Thirteen Adventures!) and ideas for renovating/upgrading (thank you Ethan Langley from American RV Restoration and Jonathan Penn from Ramble!) The apex of the rally though was the raffle managed by Dan and Jennifer Dice — donations by generous sponsors raffled off raised \$4,500 for the local food bank, Hillsboro Interfaith Ministries. From there, 10 rigs headed off to Crystal Beach on Bolivar Island for the annual **Region 9 Airstreams in Paradise Rally** at Camp Margaritaville. This resort-based rally drew 161 rigs from Texas and Oklahoma (including a few from outside the region) and more than 300 attendees for five days of sand and sun.

Our largest rally in 20 years highlighted music, a hot dog roast on the beach, crafts, and a tour of the local Bolivar Lighthouse undergoing restoration. Clubs donated baskets of beach-related goodies for the raffle, which raised \$5,300 to help the Bolivar Lighthouse Foundation complete necessary repairs. Just a couple of weeks after Airstreams in Paradise, we hosted the National Event Rally, **Stitchin' & Fishin'**, in its third iteration. Twenty-four sewists spent three days in instruction and free-sewing while partners learned woodworking techniques (thank you Bill Steddum and Greg King!), participated in a Blackstone/Pizza Oven cook-off, and caught enough fish on the guided fishing tour for a huge fish fry on the last evening of the rally.

Now here is what is going on with a few of our clubs:

The **Greater Houston Airstream Club** has their route to Minot already planned with six stops on the way north. Leaving August 5th, around 15 rigs will cover around 1,840 miles over the 15-day trip — as of April 10th there were a few spaces left according to President Lisa Feine ([lfeine1@gmail.com](mailto:lfeine1@gmail.com)).

The **Oklahoma Airstream Club (OAC)** began planning a caravan to Minot last fall. The Caravan Leader for this activity is Larry Walters ([walcous@gmail.com](mailto:walcous@gmail.com)). As you read this column, the club is enjoying a four-day weekend at Natural Falls State Park in Colcord, Oklahoma, April 30 through May 3. This will be a unique rally as they host their first Airstream WEDDING! Two members of OAC fell in love with camping (and with each other), deciding to tie the knot with all their camping friends. The details of the OAC fall rally are still being finalized but, at present, it is set to be held Oct. 22-25 in Miami, OK. This will be an urban rally held on the streets of the Miami Downtown Historic District, with emphasis on the 100th Anniversary of Route 66.

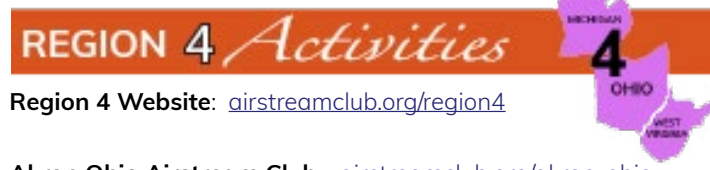

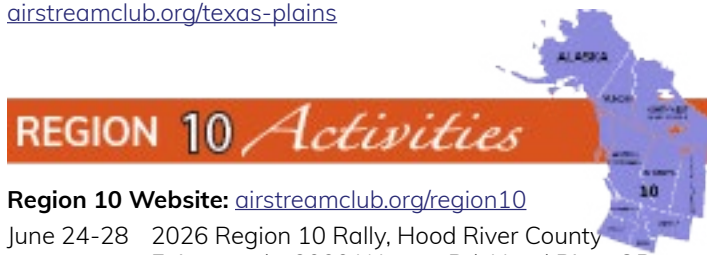

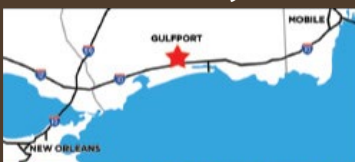
