TV Problem

Problem: I have a 2003 Safari that I bought new back in 2003, but I have not really been able to use it much until last summer. It has the original Winegard antenna. While I do not watch very much TV, the option might be nice. What do I need to add, do or change to watch TV now? I have read several things on some forums, but I am not sure they make sense to me. I just hooked up an older TV to the antenna and could not get anything on channels 1 through 100. I will get up on the roof, perhaps tomorrow and make sure the antenna is connected.

Answer: You need a Digital Converter and an add-on for your Winegard for decent TV. I have enclosed a paper on how to do the conversion from the Digital TV signal to an analog one. My guess is that you're old TV is analog and that is why nothing comes out. The converter box is relatively inexpensive, approximately \$25 or less on eBay. In addition, there is an add-on piece for the Winegard which you can get from Camping World or almost any RV dealer. No wires, it just plugs into the existing antenna. The new digital TV signals are at a much higher frequency so you need to optimize the antenna for these frequencies.
