





These Tools Are Your Best Friends



As we have all experienced, almost everything in our home-on-wheels, seem to constantly loosen up. It is amazing how road vibration can unscrew things (or screw things up)! That's why screw drivers are your best friends!

Every so often, it is wise to set aside just 10 minutes to go through your rig and tighten every screw you can find. Don't forget to check those that aren't immediately visible, as they can loosen up just as easily. There is no need to over-tighten—simply snug each screw to ensure it's secure. This straightforward habit can help you avoid more significant problems and frustrations down the road.

Doors and Drawers



This is a great place to start! Just using them can cause them to loosen up; however, I have been amazed how many door/drawer screws come loose “on their own”. Cabinet doors, shower doors, screen doors, bathroom doors, kitchen drawers. Also, if you have a drawer that weebles and wobbles or just doesn't seem to close properly, it is probably due to some loose screws. You'll need to remove the drawer to find them.

So, what about the main door?

Well, that is held in place with bolts and nuts and can be tightened as well. However, tightening these are a little more involved, requires extra care and should be done with other door adjustment to ensure a smooth and tight fit. If you feel your door needs tightening/adjusting, I'm happy to help.



Cabinets



Those overpacked cabinets hanging down from the ceiling and onto the walls are held in place with screws. So, you certainly don't want them to loosen up as they are bouncing down the highway. You really want to make sure these are snugged up and if you find some that just won't tighten, then you'll need to replace it with a slightly larger one.

And don't forget the hinges on the cabinet doors. You may just find that snugging them up solves your frustration with them popping open or not closing.



Walls



All of the interior walls are held in place with screws. They can be found holding walls to one another, holding the walls to the ceiling and holding the walls to the floor. You'd be amazed at how much flexing these walls go through as you are moving, turning and leveling. So, snug them up!



Trim



Ever walk into your Airstream after a long drive day and find a trim piece, light or vent laying on floor? Well guess what? Loose screws are usually the culprit. There is trim everywhere and the screws are begging to be tightened. The trim around your microwave actually holds it in place as well.



Exterior



Although it seems that the outside of your Airstream is full of rivets, you'd be surprised how many screws are out there as well. Water inlets, electrical outlets, door holders, trim, shore power receptacle, black tank flush inlet, vents and reflectors all depend on tight screws to both keep them in place AND keep water out of your Airstream.



So, what can you do if you find screws that always loosen up or are stripped out?

Well, if they are going into metal, you can use thread locker. **CAUTION:** Make sure it is the *blue* version which is *removeable*. There is a *red* version which is permanent.

If the screw is going into wood, you can find many hacks on YouTube. However, one of my favorite approaches uses toothpicks. Check this out: [Toothpick hack](#).



So, go ahead, grab a cup of coffee and your favorite set of screw drivers and tighten away. You'll be glad you did; especially when nothing is laying on the floor when you arrive at your next destination!
