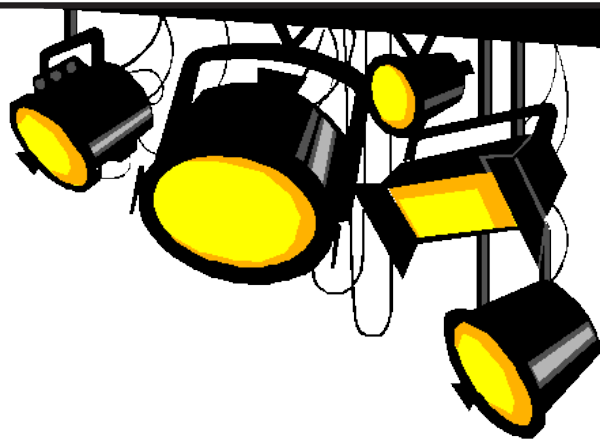

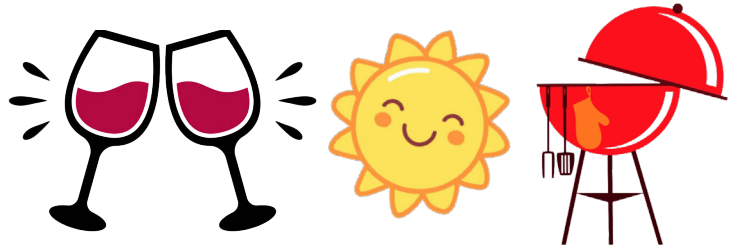

Co-Editor David's Travelogue

June 2026: Hodgepodge Lodge

This is the last issue of The Roundup before your editorial staff begins their customary summer hiatus. Even though I have enough material from our fall and winter trip to Connecticut to cover several more issues, I think this would be an ideal time to wrap up with some random selections—a hodgepodge, if you will.

History

As one of the original 13 colonies, history is everywhere around you in CT. Let's go back to Revolutionary times and the first submarine. Down at the end of Ayers Point Road in Old Saybrook, there's a plaque which commemorates the "Turtle." It reads, "Turtle" was the first subversive [I think they mean submersible, ed.] vessel with a documented record of use in combat, employed against the Royal Navy in New York Harbor during the American Revolutionary War. It was built on this site in 1775 by American inventor David Bushnell, who George Washington dubbed "a man of great mechanical powers, fertile in inventions and master of execution." You can see a full-size replica at the [Connecticut River Museum](#), one town upriver in Essex.

While in Essex, do visit the [Griswold Inn](#). Opened in 1776, "The Gris," as some call it, is one of the oldest continuously run inns in the country. You can still eat, drink, and book a room there. Be sure to stay over on a Monday night so you don't miss The Jovial Crew singing rollicking and ribald sea chanteys. Think colonial honkytonk.

Other notable sites: Fort Trumbull in New London and Fort Griswold across the Thames River in Groton. The traitor, Benedict Arnold, captured the latter in September, 1781 at the Battle of Groton Heights, slaughtering the colonials after their leader, Lieutenant-Colonel Ledyard, surrendered. You can visit the site of the [Arnold Homestead](#) 15 miles up the Thames in Norwich.

Art

Two museums worth a visit: the Florence Griswold (or "Flo Gris," as they call themselves these days) in Old Lyme and the Lyman Allyn in New London. Florence Griswold (1850–1937) inherited the family home. Approaching the age of 50 with few economic prospects, she opened her house to boarders. In 1899, one propitious visitor was the artist, Henry Ward Ranger, who was so captivated by the place, he returned with fellow artists in subsequent years. They formed what became known as the Old Lyme Art Colony, notable for the development of American Impressionism. The Griswold owns many of their works, as does the Lyman Allyn. The prize of the Allyn collection, though, is the gallery of works by Louis Comfort Tiffany. Though he lived in New York, his parents hailed from Killingly, and he married a gal from Norwich. They often visited relatives in Norwich and New London and the collection emphasizes those CT connections.

Honorable mention: [Zagray Farm Museum](#) in my hometown, Colchester. This is not hung-on-your-wall art; it's machine art. Zagray is a 200-acre farm purchased by a Polish-Ukrainian couple in 1916. They had 3 sons, Stanley, Harry, and William, who shunned modern life and they remained unmarried on the farm until their deaths in the early 2000s. Largely independent and self-sufficient, they built on their property a dairy barn, a machine shop, a foundry, and a brook-powered turbine, which provided a modest amount of electricity. They even moved an 1870's sawmill from Granby, which is still working today. Having no heirs, they bequeathed the property to the Colchester Historical Society to be preserved as a "Snapshot in Time." Today, it's run by the Quinebaug Valley Engineers Association. If you like machines and earth-moving equipment, just go. It's like a big boys' sandbox.

The Best Bike Ride Ever

Start at the Baldwin Bridge Boat Launch on Ferry Road, under I-95 in Old Saybrook. Ride up route 154 to Essex. Turn right on South Main Street to the older part of Essex. Ride through the village past the Griswold Inn and down to the Connecticut River Museum. Take the back way (North Main Street, River Road, Essex Street) to Deep River. Cross 154 and follow Union and Maple to Chester. Head out North Main and Goose Hill to Kings Highway. Follow that to the river and the Chester-Hadlyme ferry. Take the ferry—\$2 for bicycles. Enjoy the 5-minute crossing and view of Gillette Castle on the bluff. On the other side, follow Ferry Road to Joshuatown Road. Ride through Joshuatown to Hamburg Cove. Criss-cross 156 through Hamburg and Old Lyme until you get back to Interstate 95. Follow the bike path over the Baldwin Bridge and back to the boat launch. It's about 20 miles through charming towns and wooded countryside. You're welcome.

Campsites are open now for the 3rd Annual Rally on Lake Murray, April 16-18, 2027

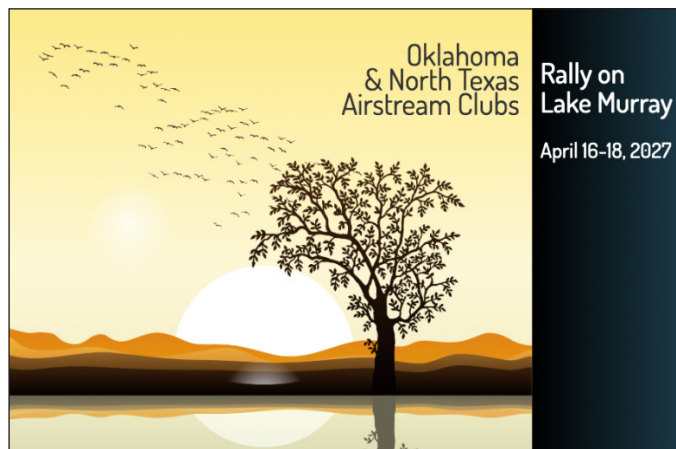

Tips for Booking Your Campsite

There's a total of 66 available campsites at Elephant Rock Campground. There are 47 with full hookups (water, electric, and sewer). The remaining sites have water and electricity only. Elephant Rock is in the yellow box on the left in the map image on the next page. Unfortunately, the reservation system DOES NOT pull ALL of the full hookup sites up when you select sewer, but it does pull up MOST, so here's a list of all the **full hookup campsites: 1-25, 27-39, and 59-67**. Also, note that sites 42 and 43 are a little on the downhill slope.

If Elephant Rock Campground is completely booked, Cedar Cove Campground is a short stroll away. These sites have water and electricity only. An orange box is around that campground on the image on the next page.

Please Note Handicap Campsites: There are few handicap campsites in Elephant Rock Campground (34, 59, and 61) and one in Cedar Cove (29). These are circled in blue on the map.
(You can book these sites without documentation, but they will kick you out of them if you don't have proper documentation when they arrive.)
