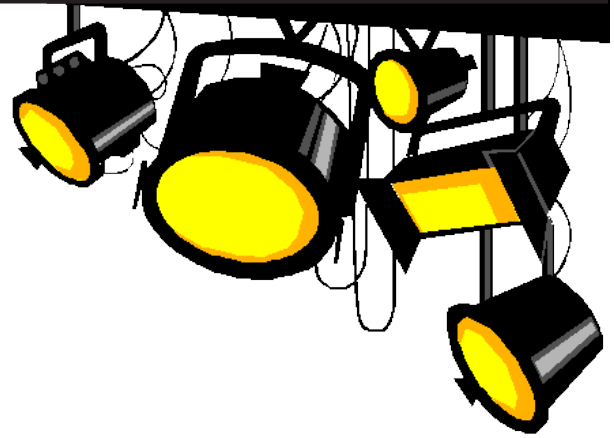

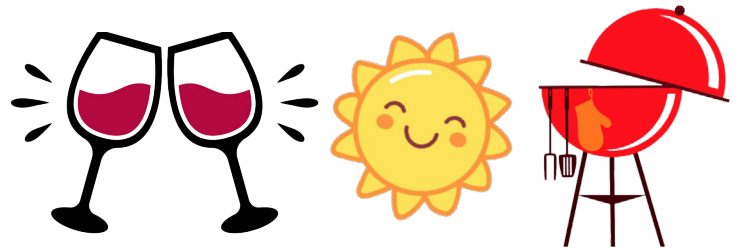

Tips for Booking Your Campsite

There's a total of 66 available campsites at Elephant Rock Campground. There are 47 with full hookups (water, electric, and sewer). The remaining sites have water and electricity only. Elephant Rock is in the yellow box on the left in the map image on the next page. Unfortunately, the reservation system DOES NOT pull ALL of the full hookup sites up when you select sewer, but it does pull up MOST, so here's a list of all the **full hookup campsites: 1-25, 27-39, and 59-67**. Also, note that sites 42 and 43 are a little on the downhill slope.

If Elephant Rock Campground is completely booked, Cedar Cove Campground is a short stroll away. These sites have water and electricity only. An orange box is around that campground on the image on the next page.

Please Note Handicap Campsites: There are few handicap campsites in Elephant Rock Campground (34, 59, and 61) and one in Cedar Cove (29). These are circled in blue on the map. (You can book these sites without documentation, but they will kick you out of them if you don't have proper documentation when they arrive.)

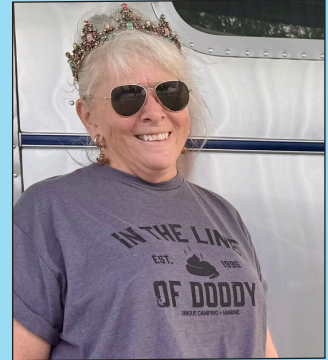

Co-Editor David's Travelogue

May 2026: It's Pronounced "ah-BEETZ"

Welcome to the third installation in my Connecticut series. We were there for 7 months last fall and winter so there's still lots to write about. Today we tackle food. Let's start with pizza.

If there's one food Connecticut may be known for, it's pizza, especially the New Haven-style made famous by joints such as Frank Pepe's Pizzeria Napoletana, Sally's Apizza, and Tony's (now Modern) Apizza. You read that right. It starts with an "a" and, like the title of this article says, it's pronounced "ah-BEETZ." I think it's a Yankee Italian dialect. For instance, you might get "rih-GOHT" (ricotta cheese) on your apizza. The New Haven Museum even has an exhibit about it, running through October 2027 so you still have time to get there — <https://www.newhavenmuseum.org/52083-2/>.

But that's not all there is to it. I picked up a "Connecticut Pizza Trail" brochure at Pizza Works, next to the Old Saybrook train station. Aside from Apizza, they identify Neapolitan, Greek, Thick, and Tavern style as local favorites. I'll bet you didn't know—quoting from the brochure—"Not only does Connecticut have the highest density of pizza restaurants in the country, but it also leads the nation in the percentage of family-owned or independent pizzerias." So do yourself a favor. When you visit, stay away from Dominos and Pizza Hut, and get your pie from a local pizza parlor. And here's a personal tip—if you're in Mystic, don't follow the movie-watching crowd to Mystic Pizza (yes, it's a real place and it's still there), cross the river to the other side of town, a little past the train station, and give Angie's a try. It's Greek style, like my favorite childhood pizza parlor, Zisi's.

Switching gears, and ethnicities, how about we talk kielbasa? The best kielbasa anywhere. Call me biased, but I've lived in Chicago and I've visited Poland a couple times. I've had my share of Polish sausages, yet I always hanker for the kielbasy I grew up with. It ain't no Hillshire Farms.

Connecticut was a popular landing place among Polish immigrants, especially in towns like New Britain, Willimantic, and Bridgeport. My mother's grandparents settled in New Britain and Hartford. As with all immigrant communities, they brought their own cuisine. One legacy of CT Poles' cuisine is the surprising number of kielbasa brands you can still find in the grocery store today. Take a gander at the photos below from the Big Y near my brother's house in Mystic. Six, count 'em, SIX different, regionally produced brands you've probably never heard of! And this isn't even a big Polish town!

Personal tip: if you're there at Easter, try Nutmeg's fresh kielbasa. It's not smoked, it's spiced differently, and it's hard to find outside the season. For something different from the super-markets, visit Little Polska market in Old Saybrook or Cliff's Quality Meats in Essex.

Collect 'em all! Trade 'em with your friends!

Alright, let's take one last left turn and finish up with apple cider. Connecticut is a big apple growing region. I think they're like the French, though, who keep the best wines at home. I don't remember ever seeing CT apples anywhere outside the state. During our visit, there was never a time we didn't have cider in the refrigerator. For us, it was a breakfast staple, although a warm cup on the deck before the weather turned too cold was a treat. We visited as many orchards as we could find, tried at least a half dozen local varieties you just don't see around here, and always walked away with a half or full gallon of cider. Kim even made deep dish apple pie ... twice! Our favorite varieties? Evercrisp and Cameo. Our favorite cider? Scott's Yankee Farmer in East Lyme (not to be confused with Scotts' Farm and Greenhouses in Essex, across the street from Cliff's Quality Meats).

Some other recommended places to visit and cider to try: Rogers Orchards in Southington; Lyman Orchards in Middlefield; Bishop's Orchards in Guilford. Don't miss B.F. Clyde's Cider Mill in Mystic.
