Trip Planning & GPS

My Approach (YMMV)

After eight years of Airstream travel to all but three of the lower 48 states (I'll let you guess which three we're missing), I've developed a system—well, sort of—to help us get from Point A to Point B. This isn't intended to be the best or only way to plan a trip. Instead, I hope it offers a few ideas that might help you plan your next adventure.

The first step, of course, is knowing where Point B is. The next—and probably the most important—step is knowing your own driving limits, both physical and psychological. You may have several stops before reaching your destination, or perhaps Point B is simply a general region rather than a specific location. Either way, deciding how to get there takes some planning. In my case, it usually involves a lot of planning, although not everyone is quite as OCD about the process as I am.

My Planning Journey

Like many RVers, my planning has evolved over the years. When we first started traveling, I used the Good Sam Trip Planner (I think it was called GS Trips, although I may be remembering that incorrectly). It worked reasonably well, but I eventually found that it didn't include every campground or RV park I was looking for. A quick Google search tells me the Good Sam Trip Planner still exists, although it now requires a Good Sam membership.

As our travels expanded, I discovered

AllStays Pro, and it quickly became one of my favorite planning tools. While it doesn't actually create routes, it's an outstanding resource for finding campgrounds. Even better, it displays information that can



be critical for RV travelers, including low overpasses, steep grades, significant inclines and declines, fuel stops, and other road hazards that you simply don't worry about when driving a car.

Eventually I found myself relying more on **Google Maps** and internet searches. Google Maps remains my favorite tool for researching destinations, attractions, grocery stores, restaurants, and previewing routes with Street View. I also spend time reading campground reviews and visiting campground websites before making reservations.



More recently, I decided to try **RV Trip Wizard**.

Airstream Club members receive a first-year discount, which certainly helps because it isn't inexpensive. I'm still learning the software, but so far I like its RV-specific routing and the ability to enter the dimensions and weight of my truck and trailer. That allows the software to suggest routes more appropriate for larger RVs. The routing interface feels a little cumbersome at times, but I'm hoping that's simply because I'm still climbing the learning curve.

GPS Is a Great Tool...Until It Isn't

One lesson I've learned over the years is this:

A GPS is a navigation aid—not a substitute for good judgment.

Most automotive GPS systems assume you're driving a passenger car. They don't know you're towing a 30-foot Airstream. Left to their own devices, they'll happily route you onto roads with low railroad bridges, narrow winding roads, steep grades, tight turns, or even historic downtown streets that were never designed for large RVs. We've all seen the pictures of RVs wedged under low bridges. In most cases, the driver simply trusted the GPS! The GPS wasn't necessarily wrong—it just wasn't designed for that vehicle.

That's one reason I appreciate tools like AllStays Pro and RV Trip Wizard. They help identify many of those hazards before you ever leave home. Even then, I still verify the last few miles into every campground using Google Street View or the campground's own directions. Campground owners usually know which GPS routes to ignore because they've watched too many guests arrive the hard way.

Fuel Stops

Once I know where we're going, I decide whether the trip will primarily use interstate highways or secondary roads. That's when my OCD tendencies really begin to show.

I usually have my fuel stops planned before we ever leave home.

Since we tow with a diesel truck, I prefer fueling at truck stops. I use the TSD/Open Roads fuel card along with the Open Roads app to locate participating stations and take advantage of diesel discounts. Because many participating truck stops are located along the interstate system, I often adjust my route to take advantage of convenient fuel stops and better pricing.

Another favorite tool—used primarily by my co-pilot, navigator, helper, and wife—is the iExit app. It's excellent for locating truck stops, rest areas, restaurants, and other services at upcoming interstate exits.



Of course, if you're the type who simply stops whenever the fuel gauge gets low, you can safely ignore everything in the previous two paragraphs.

Overnight Stops

When we're traveling from Point A to Point B, we usually look for campgrounds where we can remain hooked up to the truck.



We've used Harvest Hosts for overnight stays, and Airstream Club members receive a discounted first-year membership.

We also belong to the Family RV Association (FRVA), formerly FMCA. Through FRVA, I joined RV Overnights, which offers a concept similar to Harvest Hosts with fewer locations but a lower annual fee. One feature I particularly appreciate is their commitment not to increase membership fees.



Although KOA campgrounds sometimes get mixed reviews, we've found them to be excellent overnight stops. They're usually close to the interstate and frequently offer long pull-through sites that allow us to stay hitched for the night.

I know many RVers overnight at Cracker Barrel. We've never tried it—I'm not really sure why—but I have to admit the idea of waking up to pancakes and bacon before getting back on the road has a certain appeal.

Airstream Tips, Tricks, and Upgrades

A New Experience at Love's

Our trip to the Williamsburg Rally gave us an opportunity to try one of Love's Truck Stop RV sites.

The drive from our home to Williamsburg is just over 340 miles. Remember those driving limits I mentioned earlier? That's just a little beyond my comfort zone for one day, especially after spending the morning packing and hitching up.

We found a Love's about 220 miles from home that offered five RV sites and decided to give it a try.

The Love's app made locating the site easy, and reserving through CampLife was simple. The RV spaces are located in front of the store rather than in the truck parking area. Yes, trucks come and go throughout the night, but with the air conditioner running we slept surprisingly well. The next morning we grabbed fresh coffee inside the store and were back on the road in just a few minutes.

Final Thoughts

After eight years on the road, I've learned that no single app does everything well.

Today my planning toolbox includes Google Maps, AllStays Pro, RV Trip Wizard, TSD/Open Roads, iExit, campground websites, and a healthy dose of common sense. Each serves a different purpose, and together they make traveling easier, safer, and a lot less stressful. I know there are many other apps not mentioned here, I just haven't gotten around to using them. Everyone has a favorite and as I said in the beginning I do pretend my way is the only or best way.

Whether you're an obsessive planner who maps every fuel stop and campground or someone who simply heads west until it's time to stop for the night, there's no right or wrong way to travel.

Just don't let your GPS do all the thinking.

The important thing is to enjoy the adventure.

After all, the journey creates many of the memories. Otherwise, we'd all just fly to our destinations.

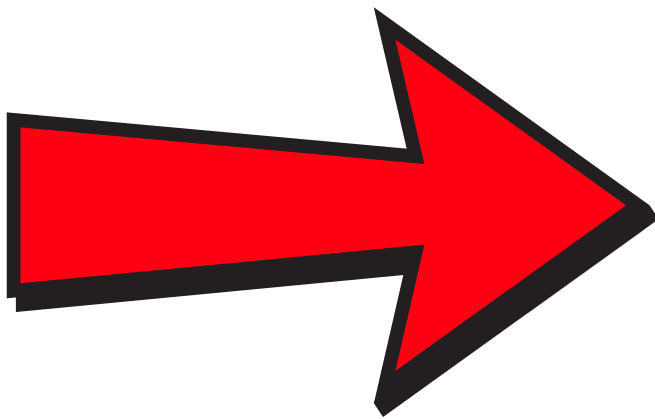
