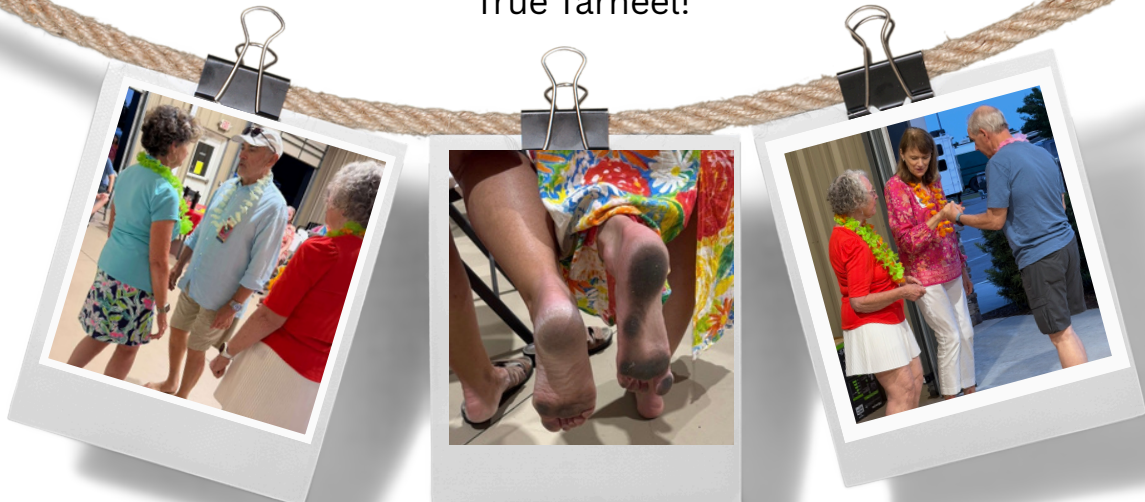

The VP's Perspective

Hi Folks,

I sure hope many of you are contemplating participating in some of our upcoming rallies. Several remain in 2026, most with space available, and are detailed towards the end of this Newsletter. Questions? Just ask any of the rally hosts or officers identified elsewhere in this newsletter.

Believe it or not, we are just 6 months out from the start of 2027 and a new rally season. Would you be a first time host? Not sure how this works?

The process is simple. Below are a few suggestions to get started:

1. Read the May 2026 Blue Beret article on rallies by Millie O'Donnell, current ACI President, on the positive impact rallies can have: <https://airstreamclub.us9.list-manage.com/track/click?u=714a911e970d9dc3ab428f988&id=4c30ab3689&e=e7f0ae66cf>
2. Select a campground and month. Call the campground try to place a hold on ~15 campsites and note their hold until date. You may want to think of a theme for your rally, but that is optional.
3. Draft a preliminary Rally Flyer and begin thinking about nearby activities to make folks aware of. Rally's generally run from Thursday arrival to Sunday departure.
4. Rally fees are collected at registration. You will be reimbursed by the PAC Treasurer for your costs. I can provide you with a template for the Flyer if desired or just pick a flyer at end of our newsletter as an example. I am happy to answer any questions you may have along the way.
5. Perhaps most importantly, know that fellow Airstreamers are always willing to chip in and help with any tasks during the rally! You are not alone. Just ask. They expect to help out.

HAPPY HOUR RECIPES

Margaritaville Style!

Margarita Dip & Pretzels

Prep time: 10 mins.

Serves: 12

Ingredients

8 ounces cream cheese softened
8 ounces whipped topping
8 tablespoons butter one stick, softened
1/4 cup tequila or lime liqueur
1 tablespoon triple sec
1 cup powdered sugar
lime zest for garnishing

Instructions

- In a mixer, cream together the butter and cream cheese.
- Add in the triple sec and tequila (or lime liqueur) and mix to combine.
- Add in the powdered sugar.
- Remove from mixer and fold in the whipped topping.
- Place in serving dish, top with lime zest. Refrigerate until ready to eat.
- Serve with salted pretzels.



Pineapple Pecan Cheeseball

Prep time: 10 mins. + chilling

Serves: 27 (2 T. per serving)

Ingredients

16 ounces cream cheese (2 – 8 oz. pkgs), softened
1/2 cup green bell pepper, diced
1/2 cup green onion, chopped or 2 Tbsps. onions, chopped
1 tsp. lemon pepper seasoning
1 tsp. seasoned salt
1 can (8 ounces) crushed pineapple, well drained
2 cups chopped pecans, divided
Assorted crackers

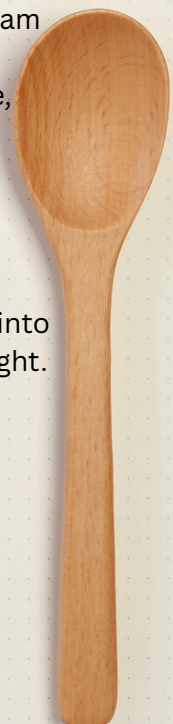

Directions

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese until smooth. Stir in drained pineapple, green pepper, onions, seasonings and 1/2 cup of chopped pecans. Place cream cheese mixture on a sheet of plastic wrap and shape into a ball. Refrigerate overnight. Before serving, roll cheeseball in remaining chopped pecans. Serve with crackers.

NOTE: Cheeseball keeps well in the refrigerator for several days.



Margarita Fresh Fruit Salad

Ingredients

*Tequila Orange Liqueur Dressing:*1/2 cup Jose Cuervo Authentic Margarita3 tablespoons orange marmalade2 teaspoons lime juice*Fruit Salad:*4 cups fresh strawberries, sliced

4 oranges, peeled and sectioned

1 honeydew melon, rind and seeds removed, cut in small chunks

1 small cantaloupe melon, rind and seeds removed, cut in small chunks

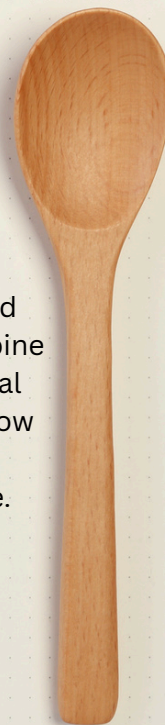
1 small pineapple, peeled and rind removed, cut into small chunks

1/2 cup fresh mint leaves, sliced thin

Directions

In a large bowl, mix together margarita, orange marmalade and lime juice. Add strawberries, oranges, pineapple, honeydew and cantaloupe. Stir to combine and refrigerate for several hours or overnight to allow the flavors to blend.

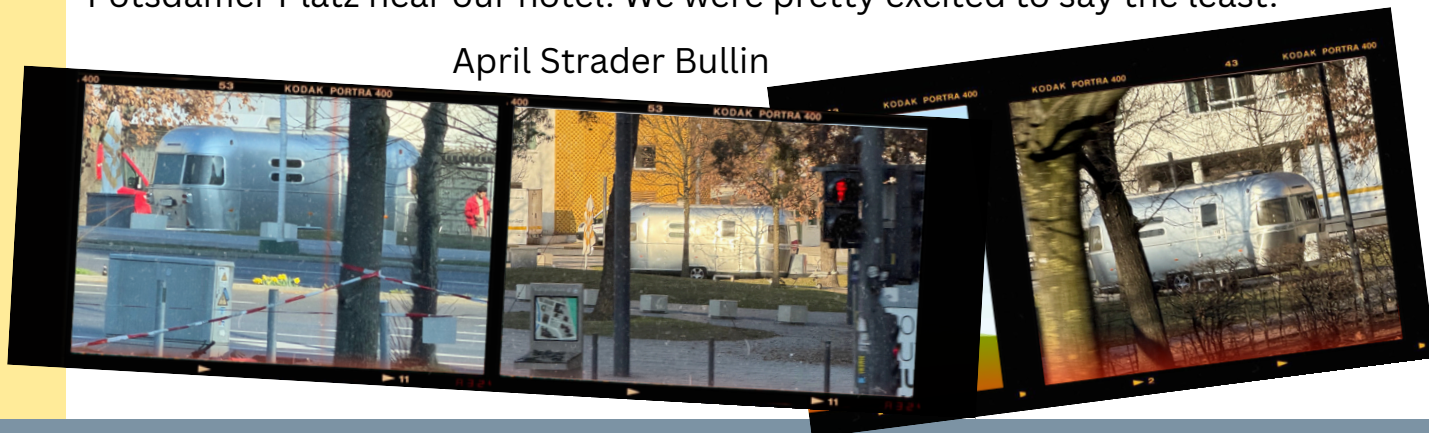
Add mint, toss and serve.

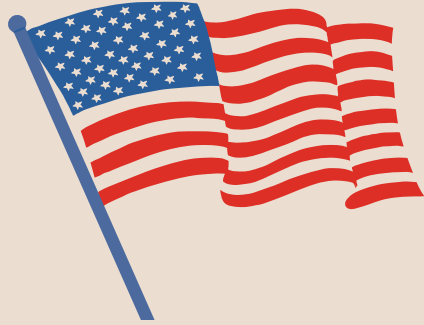

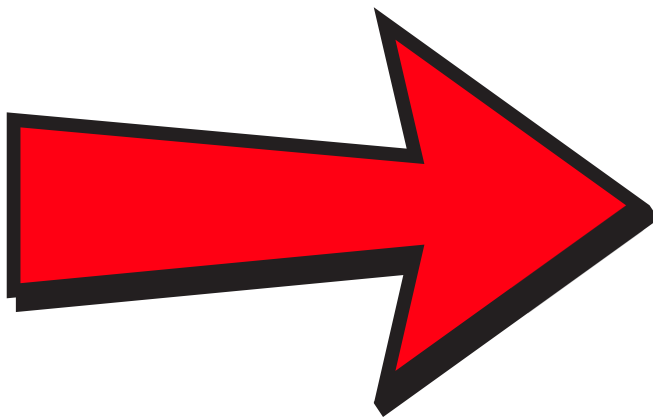
