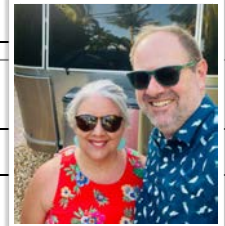

President's Corner

A Note from the President



In early spring 2019, our aging 1999 GMC hauled our leaky 25' Gulfstream travel trailer to Asheville, North Carolina. The truck was barely holding together, with its rusty body and a butter knife needed just to get the CD player working. The SOB had seen better days, and the trailer's spongy roof came with a snarky warning from a questionable repair shop: "Just don't walk on it." We caulked it, shrugged, and rolled on.

That scrappy setup had taken us everywhere—around Michigan, the Midwest, Canada, the East Coast—and confirmed that we genuinely loved travel by trailer. Then, in Asheville at our campground, I spotted it: a shiny silver Airstream 27' Flying Cloud paired with a majestically blue F-150. I leisurely walked past it all week with the dog, dreaming of a tour and armed with my mental list of questions, slowly becoming what my husband would later call "hyper-fixed."

As we left the campground—with our truck protesting one last time—the Airstream owner finally appeared. I had about 30 seconds for an impromptu interview through our rolled down truck window. That quick conversation turned into 750 miles of ride-home research and a full-blown obsession. By the end of that summer, our dreams became reality: a blue F-150 and a 27' Airstream International of our own was our newer (and safer!) camping set up.

What surprised me most was not just the trailer – which I loved impossibly more than I expected - but the community. We joined ACI in 2020, went to Silver on Silver in 2021, and hosted our first rally in 2022. Since then, we have been all in — attending, hosting, and connecting with fellow Airstreamers year-round.

This spring, we will return to Asheville in a newer GMC (with CarPlay!) and a 30' International — feeling so grateful and nostalgic for the moment a bucket-list dream became real. Every trip, I can only hope a future 'streamer bombards me for information. I'm ready to talk – and MAC members know I am always in for Airstream tours.

What is on your wish list: a lithium upgrade, a caravan or rally somewhere you haven't been, maybe three more feet? Whatever it is, I hope you find it this season. MAC has a packed year of rallies and fun planned for you. The complete camping schedule for the season is available on the ACI website and later in the newsletter. Please check it out and join us!

In 2026, my hope is to tour your trailer and ask a million questions. Happy Camping!

Metro Detroit

We'll start the caravan by meeting in the Metro Detroit area on September 18. After the Opening Banquet and getting acquainted, we'll spend three full days exploring the city of Detroit – a trip to Eastern Market, the Detroit Institute of Art, First Congregational Underground Railroad Living Museum, and the newly restored Michigan Central Train Station are just some of the options. Visits to Belle Isle and Hart Plaza will also be included.

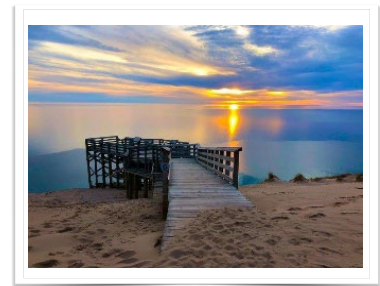


Kalamazoo

Our second stop is Kalamazoo where you'll get a chance to explore the Gilmore Car Museum, visit the Air Zoo Museum, a Bird Sanctuary, and other local places of interest.

Grand Haven

From Grand Haven (near Grand Rapids), we'll explore the Meijer Sculpture Garden and visit the Grand Rapids Riverfront. Free time in Grand Haven will allow you to visit the Gerald Ford Presidential Museum, take a day trip to Holland, Saugatuck and/or St. Joseph, or take a bike ride on Lakeside Trail.



Traverse City

In Traverse City, we'll visit Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore, tour the Traverse City State Hospital, take a winery tour on the Leelanau Peninsula, visit Fishtown and even have the option of taking fly fishing lessons.

Mackinaw City

On the way to Mackinaw City, you'll have time to stop and explore the towns of Charlevoix, Petoskey, and Harbor Springs and drive through "The Tunnel of Trees". While we're in Mackinaw City, we'll take the ferry to Mackinaw Island where you'll have time to explore and/or bike around the island. No visit to the island is complete without having lunch at the Grand Hotel.

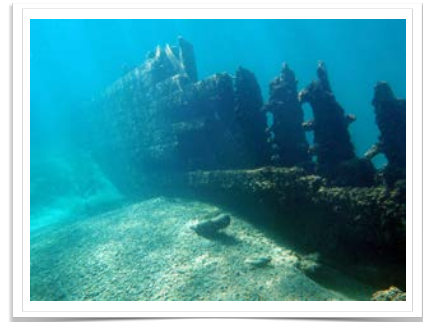


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Alpena

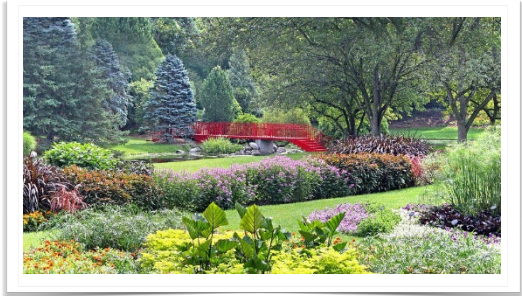


Grayling

And in Bay City we'll see a show at the Delta Planetarium and have opportunities to visit the Bay City Historical Society – home of the Michigan Rock & Roll Legends Hall of Fame, visit the Saginaw Valley Naval Ship Museum, visit the Antique Toy and Firehouse Museum or walk the Center Avenue Historic District.



Frankenmuth

A quick visit to Frankenmuth will give you time to explore their quaint downtown, have a world-famous chicken dinner at either the Bavarian Inn or Zehnder's, and visit Bronner's Christmas Wonderland, World's Largest Christmas Store.



Ypsilanti

Our last stop in Ypsilanti will include trips to The Henry Ford Museum, Greenfield Village, and a Ford factory tour to see how they build all those Ford pick-ups. We'll have our Closing Banquet on October 23 and wish you all safe travels when you leave the caravan on October 24.

Of course, there will be plenty of meals included, social times, GAMs, and other activities!

Notice for Groups Traveling to the Airstream Club International Rally in Minot, NC

Local club officers received the following guidance for groups who want to park together at the Minot rally. Please read this if you are traveling with friends to North Dakota.

Local Club Officers,

As you make plans to travel to Minot, ND for the International Rally, we want to ensure that members who wish to be parked together can be accommodated.

Please note that **dedicated parking designations are only available for groups that are traveling and/or arriving together with a minimum of five (5) participants**. Traveling groups must have **designated leader** responsible for coordinating travel plans and communications with the ACI office. The group leader must register the caravan with me at least 90 days before the start of the rally, which is **May 24, 2026, for the Minot rally**.

If your group is traveling together and would like to be parked together, please send an email to rally@airstreamclub.org with the following information for **all** members in your traveling group:

- BRNs
- Names
- Desired Arrival Date for the group

Groups who do **not** arrive together will not be able to be parked together. After confirming the parking date, it is the responsibility of the group leader to ensure that all participants register for the same parking date. Registering early ensures that the parking team can plan appropriate staging, traffic flow, and campsite allocation for all groups.

Your cooperation is essential to helping the parking team prepare and provide a smooth arrival experience for everyone.

Airstreams Return to Cadillac: 60th Anniversary Celebration Rally by Pegeen Smith, BRN 8039

60 years ago this summer marks a momentous event in Cadillac, Michigan. The 9th Annual Wally Byam Caravan Club International Rally was hosted in this small Northern Michigan town with 2828 Airstreams in attendance! Come join us this summer to celebrate! This is our 3rd year for the Airstreams Return to Cadillac Rally and we are excited to share that, in addition to all the usual fun activities and service projects, we have extended the rally to include some new exciting events:

- The Amateur Radio Club (ARC) of the Wally Byam Caravan Club International has its own remarkable history and was established in 1963, 63 years ago. Michigan Airstream Club member, Mike Harkness will provide a presentation about how to become a ham radio licensee and will set up a station each day to provide ham radio demonstrations and answer questions. In addition, Mike will get a special callsign commemorating the anniversary of the international rally and run the station to spread the word across the network all over the world!
- If you were at last year's rally, you are sure to remember Stan Schwenke. He attended representing SkyMed but many of us learned that as a child, Stan and his family traveled around the United States in a 26 ft Airstream as an acrobat family called Vernon, Bumpy and Company. Stan's nickname was "Bumpy". The Airstream was custom made with a kitchen in the front, a bathroom in the back and 8 bunkbeds in the middle! Stan has agreed to present his talk which he has done at many of the International Rallies in the past. He is a wonderful storyteller and entertains you with stories about his life on the road performing in farm fields, as well as on the Ed Sullivan show. You won't want to miss this.

During the rally, the hosts will sprinkle in some of our archival materials, sharing what rally goers were up to in 1966 and what was written about the event by the Cadillac Evening News.

MAC Shares

More Western Rally Hopping, and Unplanned Winter Camping Our Way Home by Dale Schneider BRN #06664

The Plan was to attend more rallies then be back in Michigan by March 21 for the MAC lunch in Byron Center. How did that work out?

Tucson-Rincon West. Jan. 4 -Feb. 18.

After the New Year's rally, we went to an RV Park on the west side of Tucson and stayed for the next six weeks. Unusual for us. We get "itchy hitch." It was like a 6-week long rally since other MAC and Region 4 members were there, Briggs, Cobbs and Bryants, to get together. Fred and I attended weekly ukelele group sessions to advance our skills. Fred and Sharon drove us to all their favorite sights in the area.

- At the park we enjoyed a concert by the award-winning, nearby Pueblo High School Mariachi Aztlan De Pueblo band.
- The Arizona-Sonora Desert Museum where we hiked and saw raptors, owls and ravens in a free-flight demonstration and talk in open mountain desert. The birds come to the trainer's raised [gloved] hand, get a treat, and rarely fly off without returning.
- At Sabino Canyon we rode the electric "crawler" up 3.4 miles and hiked down and enjoyed the birds and waterfalls from recent rains along the way.
- The old Tucson downtown barrios [neighborhoods] were an architectural treat to walk around. We rode the free modern streetcar around town and to the U of A campus to enjoy the art and sculptures there. Also, at U of A we toured the Richard F. Caris Mirror Lab, the only place in the world where huge mirrors are made that are used in giant telescopes on earth and in space.
- San Xavier del Bac Mission. Nearby, south of the RV park we visited this Spanish Colonial Baroque style church completed in 1797 when the area was still part of New Spain. It has survived an earthquake and lightning strikes. It has been designated a National Historic Landmark. The Mission has been continually operating since its founding in 1692 and is the oldest intact European structure in Arizona. Open daily for worship and to the public, it still serves the Tohono O'odham native people. Restoration of the sprawling building and hundreds of statues, murals and other artwork is ongoing and funded largely by donations.
- Southeast of Tucson we visited the 140-year-old working cattle Empire Ranch. Now owned by the BLM, nearby ranchers lease BLM land for grazing and a foundation works to maintain and restore the house and outbuildings. South of the ranch house mapped, unpaved ranch roads wander through Las Cienegas National Conservation Area grasslands, where there are several primitive campsites big enough for friends to camp together.

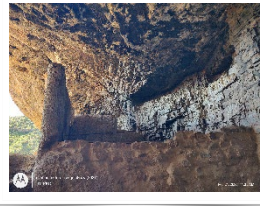


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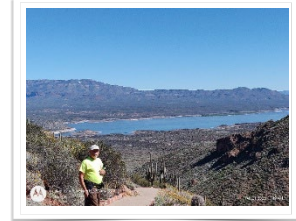
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Roosevelt Lake AZ. Feb. 19-21

We followed the Salt River up a breathtaking canyon and mountain to Roosevelt Lake named for Theodore who dedicated the dam in person in 1911, the oldest of the 6 dams on the Salt River. Our Tonto National Forrest-Fraiser Group Camp for this Arizona club rally was dry camping with a nearby water tap and was adjacent to the Horse Camp. A



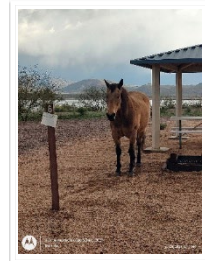
wandering mare owned by the horse camp host greeted us. Views of the lake, low like all reservoirs in AZ, were still great and it was a short hike to the shore. A 5-minute drive on Saturday took us to the Tonto National Monument cliff dwelling ruins. The hike up to the ruins was short but steep. There are cliff dwelling ruins of many tribes in the southwest. View of half the lake from the ruins' elevation.



Mesa, AZ. Feb. 22-25

We needed someplace to go for 4 nights until our next rally. 4CU members Doug and Diane hosted us in their huge driveway. Their city lot was very large and we enjoyed the "backyard fruit" of lemons, orange and grapefruit from trees they had planted. They were also going to the next rally. Disks and rotors were replaced on our truck at Doug's favorite repair shop. Picked up new temples for *both* pairs of Dale's glasses that had broken. The "cheaters" we bought for him to get by were quickly retired and are looking for a new senior owner. We shopped at "The Michigan Store" near their house for Kogels brats and dogs, and Sleeping Bear Farms honey mustard [made by the company I retired from.] Nice to get some of our favorites. No one in Arizona grocery stores knows what ring baloney is.

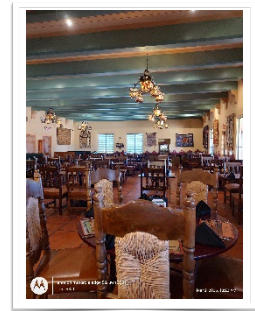
Fountain Hills, AZ. Feb 26-28



McDowell Mountain is one of five of the Maricopa County Regional Parks that have camping. Most of the 12 parks were created in the 1950's. What forethought! We were in the group camp area with water access & nearby dump station. Our last rally.

Winslow, AZ. March 1-3

We went north to I-40 and Homolovi State Park which has brand new bathrooms and showers and was only ¼ full. Ruins are at this site also but are scattered having been vandalized for many years. Temperatures neared 32F at night, 50's in daytime. Having "stood on the corner" in a previous trip we instead explored the restored La Posada Hotel and ate breakfast there. Built in 1930 in opulent southwest style, now fully restored, it was one of the famous Harvey Girl hotels, a collaboration between Harvey Company and the AT&SF railroad when railroads began catering to the wealthy in the 30's. It is still a daily Amtrak passenger stop with train service between Chicago and LA. Dining in the Turquoise Room served by our formally dressed waiter, Eric, the only patrons there, we felt like royalty. Worth reading the history of the Harvey Hotel chain.



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East on I-40 March 4-7

Two Harvest Hosts brew pubs in NM, the Amarillo Welcome Center, and the Elk City, OK Walmart.

Oklahoma City Mar. 8-10.



Twin Fountains RV Park. The Bryants told us about this stop. We did laundry and visited the National Cowboy Museum. The park has a free limo shuttle to and from the museum. Huge, fabulous museum. Healthy lunch fare at the museum café. Warmer here. Severe thunderstorms with tornado sirens going off and alerts on our phones. We headed for the concrete bunker in the office/camp store building. Thankfully the funnel went south. This same long line of storms caused the tornados in southern Michigan.

Joplin MO, Sullivan MO, Springfield IL Mar. 11, 12, 13.

Pull-thru sites at Cracker Barrel and each night colder.

Indiana Dunes State Park March 14-18.

Electric only site. Limited services: one shower open, one frost free hydrant for water, dump station. A dozen tents and a few RV's when we arrived on Saturday. Most of the tents cleared out Sunday. Cold, mostly freezing nights, a couple warmer days. A couple cars with people sleeping in them one night. Snow on the 16th when most of Northern MI got a big blizzard. Filling a 30lb propane tank every 4 days, we turn the furnace down to 50F at night and have an electric blanket that warms the bed up before we hop in. This is a park within a park. The State Park is surrounded by the National Park. Only the National Park visitor's center was open. The train station right outside the park was very busy. Tickets to the museum station in Chicago are only \$10 one way and the ride takes an hour. We couldn't see much of the parks this trip and we'll be back some year in late April or May to appreciate the migratory bird flyway here.

Byron Center, MI. March 19-24.

Woodchip Campground with full hookups. Freezing nighttime temperatures all but 2 nights and some warmish days. We attended the MAC lunch on Saturday and stayed 3 more nights because our neighbor reported there was still too much snow in the driveway at our house.

Benzonia, MI March 25.

Home. Shoveling required to get in the driveway. *March is too early to come back to Michigan, next time April 1 or later!*
