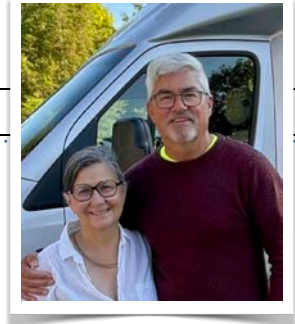

Remembrances by Carol Jean Beard BRN 8150

In 2006, twenty years ago, my husband, Jeriel, and I joined WBCCI and the Michigan Airstream Unit. Through the years, we've met and grown to love so many amazing members.

I realize you probably don't know these two women I'm writing about, but they are your club ancestors. They helped to fortify the club's DNA. While members, they helped maintain the highly reputable Michigan unit. As the poet John Donne wrote in 1624, "Any man's death diminishes me, because I am involved in mankind; and therefore, never send to know for whom the bell tolls; it tolls for thee."

Hopefully, I will make this article interesting enough that you will continue reading. Today, I'm eulogizing two memorable, ambitious, fun-loving women, Anita Briggs and Clarice Rocho. Clarice died August 18, 2025, and Anita just died this Spring, May 5, 2026.

For years, Clarice Rocho was a highly involved worker for the unit. In my opinion, she wasn't given the recognition or appreciation she deserved. She was our Hospitality Chair, which isn't an officer's position (but maybe should be). She was in charge of our drop-in breakfasts and for our refreshments after evening entertainment.

Being a Hospitality Chair is a time-consuming responsibility. Clarice shopped for breads, bagels, muffins, donuts, peanut butter, jelly, cereals, milk, fresh fruit and lots of coffee, cream and sugar. Evenings offered ice cream and/or cookies, decaf coffee, hot chocolate and all kinds of treats...not always healthy but delicious!

Clarice made sure everything was ready and available like paper products, etc. She had to keep an inventory from one rally to the next. She kept receipts to give to the unit Treasurer. Clarice and husband, John, attended most, if not all, the rallies. Clarice obviously took that responsibility seriously and we were the beneficiaries.

The Rochos were rally hosts many times. They often co-hosted rallies with Bob and Mary Connors. Not to downplay rally hosts' responsibilities today but hosting a rally years back required lots of detailed planning. We always had a printed rally program which provided the daily schedule of events. Plus, we normally went on a couple organized tours, occasionally had guest speakers, and had a church service.

Clarice was reliable and gave of her time because she cared deeply for the unit, which was for most of us extended family. I'm quite sure John helped her with the shopping if only driving her to unfamiliar grocery stores and back. Clarice and John joined the unit in 1996.

Anita's parents were in the Michigan Airstream Unit at the same time my folks were in the unit so Anita and I always had this special connection...both being second generation Michigan Airstream Unit Airstreamers. At the 50th unit anniversary celebration, held Friday, October 12, 2007 at the Ionia Fairgrounds, Anita's mother and dad, Ruth and Max Brown, sat with my dad, Ralph Clark. My mother, Velma, died in 2002.

As a side comment, there were lots of people at the 50th celebration! Several older members who had sold their Airstreams attended. The ceremony was special. The amount of shared memorabilia brought back so many memories. There were lots of photo albums, rally ribbons and rally plaques from all over Michigan, Region IV and International. Stories of past events were shared. It was so much fun!

Anita and her husband Ken were both officers of the unit when Jeriel and I joined. Ken was unit Treasurer and Anita was unit Membership Treasurer (MT). Before her, Anita's mother, Ruth Brown, was MT. The unit membership was larger during their years in office although the current membership is growing, which is wonderful.

Ken and Anita held those officer positions for several years, I think 10, prior to our joining the MAC. Not long after we joined, Ken and Anita asked Jeriel and me if we would consider taking over those officer positions, which we did. Ken and Anita remained highly involved in the unit. They both served as unit President...Anita in 2011 and Ken in 2015.

When Anita was President and for many years after, we held round table discussions and regular official meetings at every rally. The round tables were typically attended by all. They brought us together in an informal setting to discuss unit concerns of all kinds...caravans, rallies, expenses and always Michelle...the old Airstream we just sold. Everyone had a voice at the table. Being together discussing the unit we loved helped build camaraderie and consensus on many issues.

Anita took being unit President seriously. She tried to keep agenda items moving along and tried to stay on topic. Anita always had a welcoming smile. Like Clarice and John, Anita and Ken also served as rally hosts on many occasions. Anita and Ken joined the unit in 1985.

They say the best things in life are the people we love, the places we've been and the memories we've made along the way. Those three criteria are the basis for my eulogizing Anita Briggs, Clarice Rocho and several others. They were dear friends. We attended so many rallies and camped at so many different locations together, and we made so many wonderful memories along the way. Anita and Clarice will always be remembered fondly by Jeriel and me.

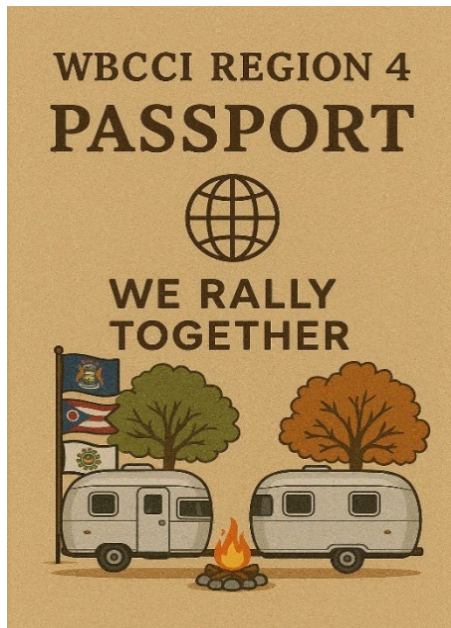

"Gemini" Receives a Power Upgrade at Ramble Trailer Works, NC by Steve and Jennifer Lee BRN #6462

There are many ways to camp. You can boondock in the wilderness, pull into a state or national park, hook up at an RV campground, visit a Harvest Host, or settle in at a luxury resort. The options are almost endless. Over the years, we've found we enjoy a little bit of everything and that flexibility is exactly what drove us to make a significant upgrade to our 25-foot Airstream Classic "Gemini".



Choosing Ramble Trailer Works

I'm a handy guy and thought I might upgrade this trailer myself. I reached out to friends in the AS community and surveyed the internet. I then imagined having all the hardware hooked up and then having to spend countless hours with Victron support to get things all working together. Considering this and weighing a number of options, we selected Ramble Trailer Works in North Carolina for the job. They're a new business but they bring real expertise in RV's including full power builds. (You may know the owner, Chad from his YouTube channel Chad's RV Reviews.) They came highly recommended by Brad Driver of Thirteen Adventures, whom we had the pleasure of meeting a couple of years back on our way to International in Sedalia. A recommendation from someone you trust goes a long way.

Designing the System

The process started with a conversation with Chad at Ramble. We talked through how we camp, what our power needs were, and what we wanted to accomplish. After that discussion, we landed on the following build:

- 600 watts of solar
- 460 amp-hours of lithium battery storage
- DC-to-DC converter (for charging while driving)
- The full Victron suite, including a 3,000-watt inverter/charger and a Cerbo GX for system monitoring and reporting

We agreed on a price and scheduled a drop-off date that corresponded with our return from our time in Florida. We dropped off the trailer at Ramble and headed back to Michigan. While Ramble had the trailer, I asked they inspect the roof and replace the skylight with a Maxim Airstream skylight. They sent pictures showing sealant wear and recommended resealing.

The Results: Clean, Professional Work

We planned a return trip to North Carolina to pick up the trailer and we were excited to see the results. We were not disappointed. The installation was neat and impressively professional. The interior modifications looked factory-finished, and honestly, the electrical wiring was better than factory! Chad spent plenty of time going over the system making sure we understood all the upgrades and how to use them. The system performed exactly as designed and better than we had hoped.



Putting It to the Test

On our way back to Michigan, we took a few extra days to camp and put the new system through its paces. We never plugged into shore power relying entirely on solar and DC-to-DC charging. The results were outstanding. During our one night stays we never dropped below 85% battery capacity. We used the microwave, lights, water pump, coffee maker and TV without concern for running out the battery.

What This Means for Our Future Camping

This upgrade is a game-changer for us. We fully enjoy and use our **Harvest Host** membership, and many Harvest Hosts locations offer no electrical hookups. With this system, those stays are now fully comfortable and capable. We can even run the AC for a few hours if needed.

We're looking forward to this summer's rallies and planned events with our newly capable Airstream. We'll surely be bringing this rig to the **Airstreams Return to Cadillac Rally in July**, a boondock rally allowing us to test everything right in our own backyard.

Chad really liked our Airstream and did a full review of the rig and upgrades. You can search YouTube for "**Chad's RV reviews**" and "**Ultimate Off-Grid build in this 2005 Airstream Classic 25**" and see the video. You will see "Bring This Floor Plan Back" on the title page.

If you're considering a power upgrade for your trailer, we'd enthusiastically recommend giving **Ramble Trailer Works** a call. They certainly get our stamp of approval.

A Very Special Place: Huntington Beach State Park, SC by Laurie McLean BRN #5792

Each spring, Earl and I take a trip south to get a start on warmer weather. We take our time getting there and back, but we plan on one main destination to stay for a couple weeks. This year that destination was [Huntington Beach State Park](#) in Murrells Inlet, South Carolina. Just a few miles south of the bustling major resort area of Myrtle Beach, it offers a serene, natural, and laid-back Atlantic beach retreat

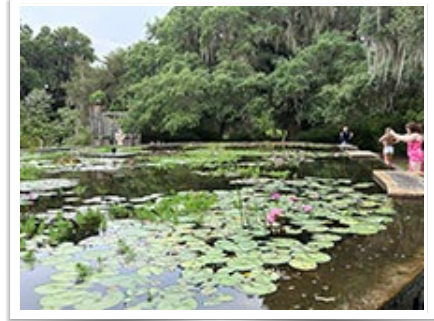
I was introduced to the area as a child when my father's South Carolina family held a reunion each May at a cottage on the banks of the large marsh area of Woodland Creek. There we went fishing for Flounder and crabbing for the Blue Crabs that made fresh feasts for the 30 or so attending family members. There also, my older cousins taught us to body-surf and swim safely along the choppy and chilly Atlantic shoreline. It's a place that holds special meaning and a rich history that is worth exploring.



The Huntington Beach State Park land was part of a large parcel purchased around 1930 by [Archer M. Huntington](#) and his sculptor wife, [Anna Hyatt Huntington](#). In addition to the beautiful marshes, woodlands, and beaches, it includes [Atalaya Castle](#), a beachside winter home and art studio built in the early 1930s. It still stands on the property today and is open for self-guided tours and special events. The land was originally leased as a state park in 1960. It is on the National Historical Register of Historic Places.

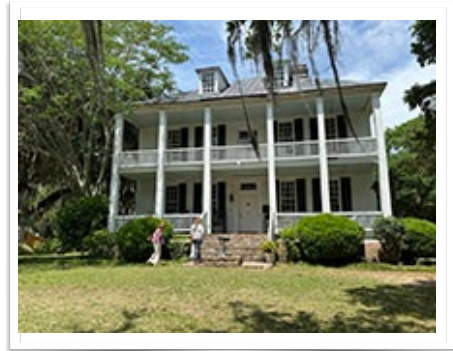


Across Highway 17 you will find [Brookgreen Gardens](#). The gardens are located on what was originally a portion of four large rice plantations purchased by the Huntingtons. The 551 gorgeous garden acres showcase many of Anna Huntington's sculptures as well as those of other artists. There is also a wildlife sanctuary, historical exhibit, gift shop, and café.



We visited two nearby historic rice plantations, like the ones the Huntingtons purchased. [Hopsewee Plantation](#), built around the year 1740, is a private residence now but you can stop by to view the house and grounds, and small museum, or get a delightful snack with tea in the River Oak Cottage Tea Room.

[Hampton Plantation](#) is another National Historic Landmark, which highlights an archeological site of a large working slave community, representative rice “field trunks” (dikes to control water flow), and a family graveyard as well as the mansion. At the giftshop I picked up a set of three historical novels [The Rice Kings](#), about the family of the inventor of the rice mill, which revolutionized rice agriculture in the area. The books paint a rich picture of life in the South Carolina lowlands from the pre-revolutionary period up to the Civil War.

Pawley’s Island to the south offers some nice shopping areas, like the [Hammock Shops Village](#), and restaurants. Murrell’s inlet has the best fish market, [Harrelson’s Seafood Market](#) featuring locally caught fish and crab cakes!

If you have not yet been to Huntington Beach State Park, I hope you will get a chance to go. It is really a camping destination treasure worth enjoying!

Camping at Huntington Beach State Park

Reservations



The South Carolina State Parks currently open [reservations](#) 13 months in advance of your starting date. You can make a reservation for up to 14 days. Huntington Beach State Park is popular! I make our reservations just after midnight the first day they become available. I used to reserve the two-week window that included the days I wanted to be there at the end. You can revise the reservation later, though there may be a fee. One year, I put a notice on the [Airstream Campsite Availability & Exchange](#) Facebook page that I was ready to revise it. An Airstreamer from Virginia was able to

coordinate with me to catch the days I was cancelling. Now, we plan to stay the full 14 days. There’s plenty to do even if you don’t want to spend every day at the beach.

Campgrounds

There are two [campgrounds](#). One is more rustic and has 30 amp electric, water and some full hookups. The other has two rows of cement padded sites with 30/50 amp full hookups. Each campground has a path directly to the beach, so campers don’t have to compete with the day users for access. Not that there are that many people anyway, but it’s nice to have direct access. Both campgrounds have fire pits, bath and laundry facilities, and trash areas that are neatly fenced.



Day Use Areas



The day use area has a general store, bathroom facilities, picnic and play areas, and a great ice cream shop. The castle is close to the day use beach area. There are also walking trails through the marshes and dunes where many birds can be spotted, as well as alligators. The alligators generally keep to themselves but keep an eye out and your dogs close!
