2026 Airstream Club International Airstream Club Rally (69th)

Your Cub Reporter <new editor> and his wife Gail secured an early arrival day, Thursday, for the international Rally in Minot, North Dakota (said My-not) and parked with the Amateur Radio (intra) Club in the Blue Campground. Note pad and camera in hand we walked up to the North Dakota State Fair Center to check in, receive our ribbon credentials, rally program and a great logo'd Rally Bag.

Why Not Minot / Visit Minot was on display for local culture (the Scandinavian Heritage Park), food, and services. The Club Hub housed Member Services, club, region, rally and caravan displays, craft classes and the fairground pizza and popcorn vendor are located. Upstairs was a counter offering hamburgers, salads, wraps, chicken tenders, popcorn and many snacks.

After the Club Hub we headed towards the Flickertail Garden and the adjacent Food Trucks. An Airstream trailer housed a vendor with drinks, sandwiches and tee shirts. An Italian Soda for Gail, I moved to the barbecue vendor; lots of typical barbecue sandwiches I steered us to the Barbecue and Tator Cups. We should have asked to see them first; both were in a squatty 20 or 24 oz cup over-flowing with fixings. Smoke sausage, mac n'cheese, coleslaw, onions, brisket, pulled pork and beans for the Barbecue; cut up baked potato, sour cream, shredded cheese, brisket, onions, peppers and more in the Tator Cup. We made 2 1/2 meals of them over the course of the rally and our first exit day on the road. More local vendors filled out the Food Truck area over the course of the rally, mostly barbecue, hamburgers, breakfast sandwiches and a great fire baked pizza stand!

Once fed it was back to our rig to visit with old and new friends, radio club members, other Airstreamers and to study our rally program for interesting sessions.

Millie didn't cover one session that was not to miss, so important that other sessions were not scheduled opposite it in the time slot, Tuesday morning's:

Inside the Mothership: An Airstream Update - presented by Josh Conner, Vice President of Sales and Mollie Hanson, Chief Marketing Officer

Josh opened the session with statistics on sales and hinted at some new models coming; BaseCamp, Flamingo, World Traveler 17 without giving everything away. Noted as in many years, Airstream Interstate are number one in the B-van category against their competition. He quickly turned it over to Mollie.

Mollie pointed out the new marketing efforts that Airstream is involved with beginning with a video, flashy with thumping audio that penetrates the soul and aimed at touching all aspects of Airstream marketing. (I am trying to get a link to the video for members to watch and enjoy).

Beyond the video Molly keyed in on:

- the new Airstream Inc. website;
- Camp Airstream Yellowstone, Nashville, Santa Fe and possibly one coming in

Bethel Woods, historic home of Woodstock;

- Staying in the culture with AIRLABS, i.e. what does the next generation of Airstreamers want. AI says it better than I could, “AIRLAB is Airstream's creative platform designed to explore innovation, design, culture, and collaborative art using an iconic Airstream trailer as a mobile canvas. Key Details:
- The Launch: The platform debuted in June 2026 with a public art installation in New York City's West Village (16 Morton Street), where over two dozen local artists transformed a 25-foot matte-white Airstream into a collaborative mural featuring graffiti, illustration, and mixed media.
- The Vision: AIRLAB functions as part incubator, part innovation studio, and part storytelling engine to see how mobility and creative expression intersect.
- Artist-in-Residence (AIR): The initiative extends into programs like the AIR residency, which gives creators a mobile Airstream working studio surrounded by nature to document their artistic process.”



- Licensing Airstream branded watches, puzzles, prints, bicycles, water bottles and more.
- Airstream Supply Company - Airstream originally thought that many of the

products and accessories would appeal to Dreamers, those dreaming of owning an Airstream wanting something small and tangible to keep their dream alive. Instead they found that most online guests were Airstreamers looking to customizing their rigs; check out the Supply Company here: airstreamsupplycompany.com .

- Other marketing pushes include Airstreams in the movies - the Accountant 2 and Minions; Airstream Stories - from people on the road, podcasters, “keeping your day dream alive” and Virtual Campfires.
- Collaborations with Stetson, Sweetwater, Explores Club.

Looking to the future - Airstream turns 100 in 2031, look for sneak peeks at what is to come!

Exhibitor's Expo Hall

Airstream of Minnesota took up the entire end of the Expo Hall with many models of Airstream travel trailers and the Interstate, Rangeline and Atlas Touring Coaches on display and for sale. Airstream Inc occupied one entire side of the Expo Hall with their regular service and repair parts for interior and exterior <why didn't I buy a spare screen door latch that broke two days ago> and their Airstream Supply Company well stocked with shirts, blouses, jackets, heavy cloth bags to replace our under the bed plastic bins and examples of their custom replacement mattresses, and fabrics for sofa and dinette cushions, curtains, bed covers and more.

Centered in amongst everything was the Expo Lounges, sofas, easy chairs, metal lawn and porch chairs like our grandparents sat in and a hot drink bar with coffee, decaf and hot water for tea. It was easy to spend more than one visit browsing everything in the Expo Hall and then relaxing with a new friend or waiting for a spouse or partner in the lounge.

Update: Streamlining Our Event Payments

Did you know our region collected or refunded members over 550 times in the last 12 months? Between the Rose Parade Rally, F1 Rally, Cali Rally, and Region Rally, our community is highly active. To support this growth, the leadership team periodically evaluates our financial service providers. Our goal is to provide members with streamlined, flexible and cost-effective payment solutions that work for everyone.

Fee-Free Payments with Zelle

You may have noticed a recent switch to Zelle for our event registrations. Zelle is a highly secure, inexpensive way for us to collect rally and incidental fees. In fact, Region 12 receives 100% of the funds you transfer through this platform.

We know some of you are new to Zelle, and a few banks imposed initial payment limits. We are incredibly grateful for your patience and willingness to try this new tool.

Transitioning Card Payments to Stripe

For those who prefer credit or debit card transactions, we have you covered. While card processors deduct transaction fees—meaning we receive about \$0.97 of every dollar sent—we know offering a card alternative is essential.

Going forward, Stripe will replace PayPal as our official payment platform for all credit card, debit card, Apple Pay, and Google Pay transactions. While we used PayPal for many years, recent registration issues and blocked payments during the Region Rally caused significant administrative hurdles for our leaders. Transitioning to Stripe ensures a smoother experience for both members and organizers.

Why Stripe is the Right Fit for Region 12:

HQ Alignment: It is the trusted payment platform used by ACI HQ, featuring proven reliability and functionality.

More Ways to Pay: It seamlessly accepts credit cards, debit cards, Apple Pay, Google Pay, and ACH payments

Lower Overhead: The processing fees are slightly lower than PayPal, keeping more money in our region.

On-Site Convenience: Members can easily use their cards at live events to pay for auction items, incidentals, and more.

Future Savings: Using Stripe gives us the opportunity to pool our payment volume across ACI to negotiate even better pricing down the road.

Think Safety on the Road

A Washington club member had a tow vehicle develop a flat tire on an Interstate. He had pulled over to the shoulder and had a state DOT truck behind him advising traffic to move over. A driver was not paying attention and hit the DOT truck as well as the Airstreamer and the DOT helper. The Airstreamer died as a result. I know we all travel to places that may not have easy pull over spots. Please do everything you can to get completely off the road if you have a mechanical issue. It is best if you can take an exit to get away from the highway. If you do not have a tire pressure monitor, please install one. I think most of us have roadside assistance. If not, please invest in a service and use it. Can I change a tire, yes. Even if it is an hour+ wait to have the roadside assistance come and help, it is worth the wait.

We have railroads on the west coast. We have a lot more railroads across the Midwest. An Airstreamer heading into Minot, ND for the International Rally was following a group of trailers into the arrival area. The 'streamer had to cross a railroad track. As the trailers he was following slowed down this streamer was left in the railroad crossing. The safety arms notifying traffic that there was an oncoming train came down right between their truck and trailer. The safety arms were metal so no easy way to drive through and break the barrier. Luckily the truck passengers were out of harm's way, but the train literally blew right

through what was once an Airstream trailer.

We all get caught up in wanting to arrive somewhere. With GPS and communications we can figure out where we need to be, but no matter what, we need to aware of our surroundings.

Introducing your New Region 12 Editor - Don Williams

I'm a retired Civil Engineer , working more than 30 years for the city of Corona, CA. My wife and I live in Riverside and bought our first Airstream in fall of 2004, a 2005 22' International CCD, with the idea of camping throughout the Western States and yearly trips to Ohio and North Carolina to visit family and friends.

Our first Airstream trip was to Joshua Tree National Park on Veteran's Day Weekend 2004 expecting a warm Southern California experience in the desert. It was until we were surprised by snow on Sunday morning! I won't go into details here but our story was chronicled in the August 2007 Blue Beret.

We joined the Wally Byam Caravan Club International in 2006 as members at large and quickly transferred to the Sierra Nevada Unit (SNU) after I stumbled upon their web pages with pictures and stories of camping in the Eastern Sierra Nevada Mountains and Great Basin Desert. We became life-time members in 2020.

The 22' CCD was replaced with a lightly used 25' international CCD; our current rig a 2012 28' international (a CCD as well). Yearly coast to coast trips, local and International rallies, Alyeska and the Canadian Rockies caravans and solo caravans to British Columbia, Northwest Territories and Ontario have added to our Airstream miles, somewhere close to 265,000 as you read this. Along the way we've attended 12 International Rallies.
